

PATTERN: CROCHET SOPHIE HOOD



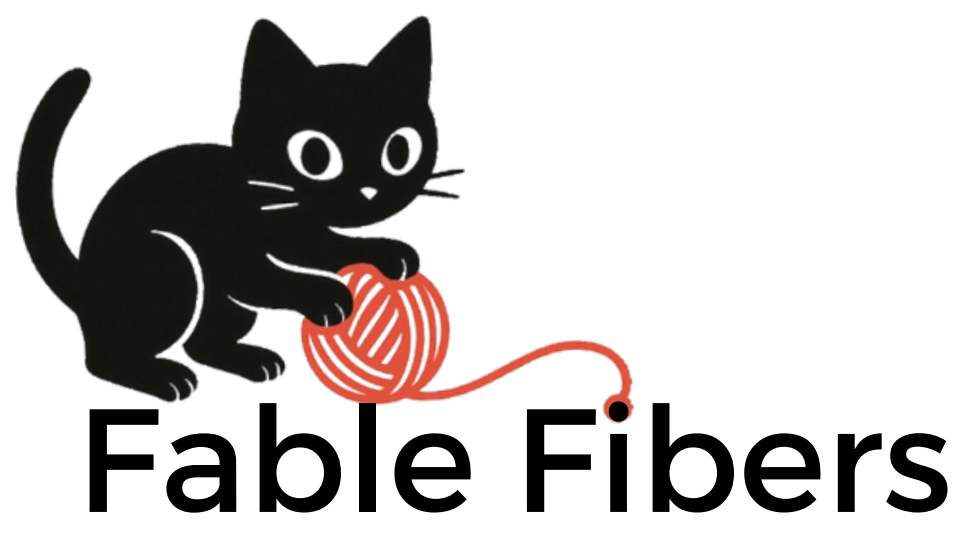
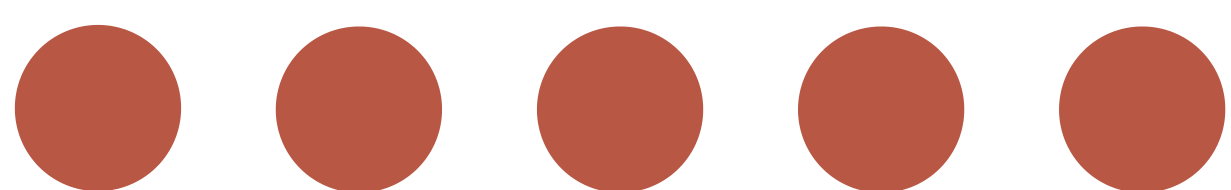


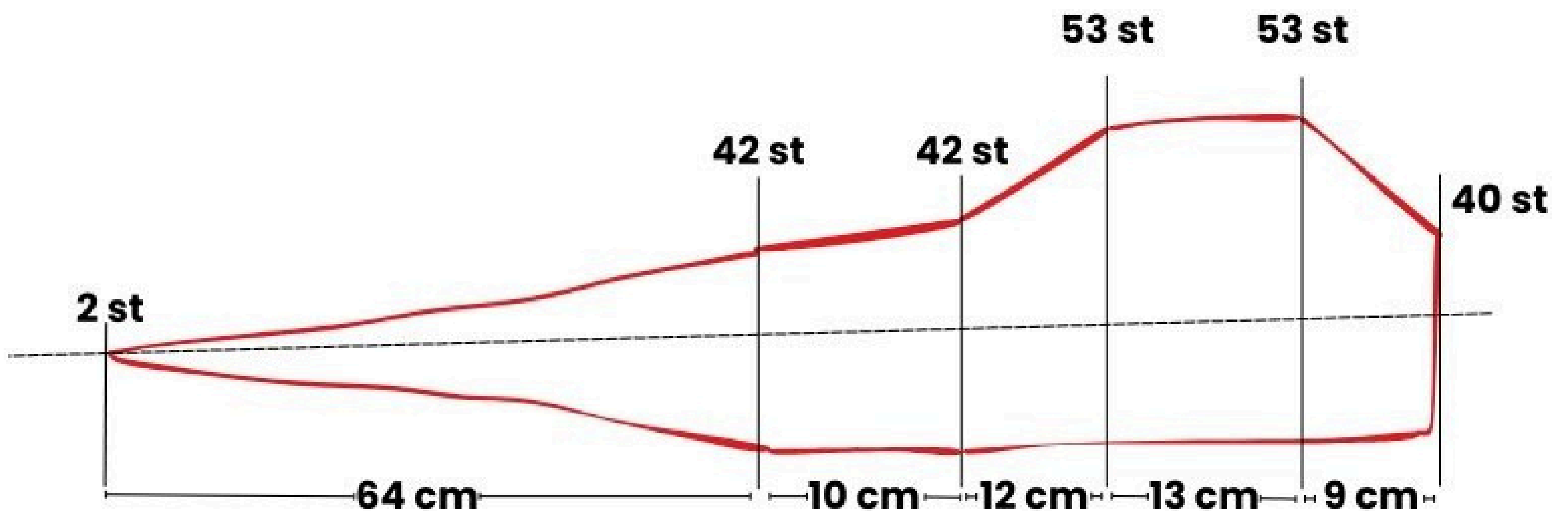
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OVERVIEW

Inspired by the elegance of the original knit Sophie Hood, this crochet version was designed with simplicity and versatility in mind. Perfect for confident beginners and experienced crocheters alike, this pattern is a modern wardrobe staple that adds a handmade touch to any outfit.



The Sophie Hood is worked in one piece from tip to tip. It is worked flat, back and forth with simple crochet stitches, creating a sleek and flattering shape. The length is fully customizable to suit your style preferences, but for standard

size i have included detailed measurements. The finished result drapes beautifully in any yarn of your choice. Whether you're crafting a cozy neutral or a bold statement piece, the Crochet Sophie Hood is the perfect project.



MATERIALS

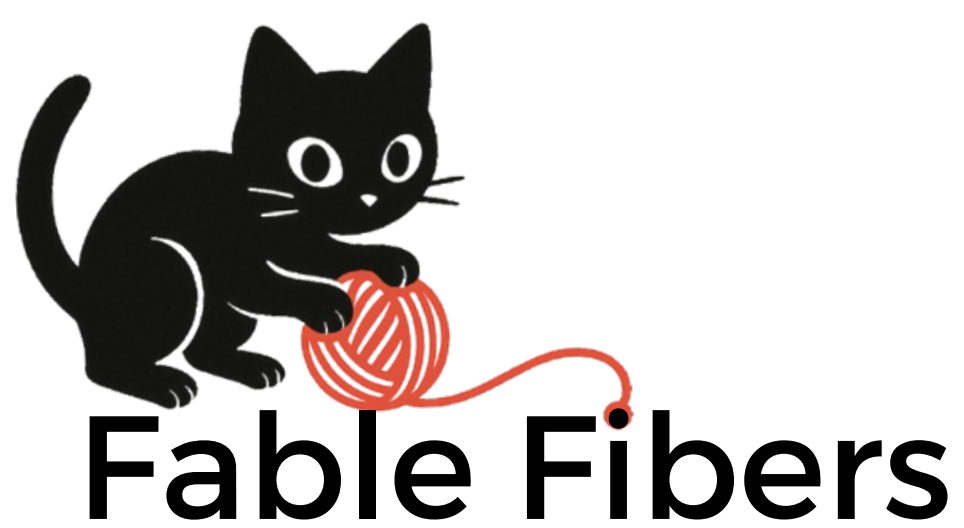
Skill Level: Confident Beginner

Materials Needed:

- I used 5.5 balls of LANG yarns MERINO 120 - 50g, (120m)
- 5.0 mm hook, stitch markers
- Scissors, yarn needle

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Any DK weight yarn could work for this pattern. Care depends on the type of yarn used. For items I wear regularly, I recommend using merino extrafine superwash yarn for easy washing and durability.



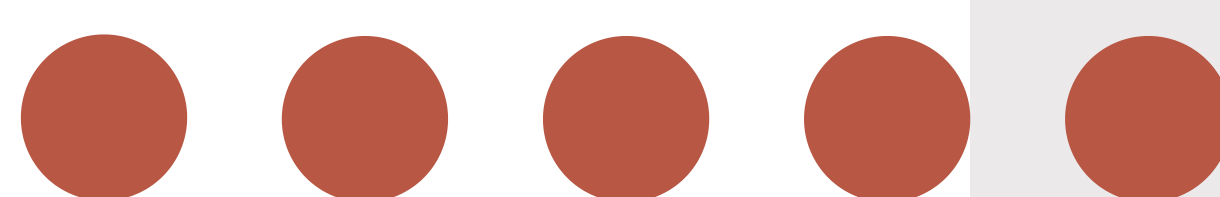
ABBREVIATIONS & NOTES

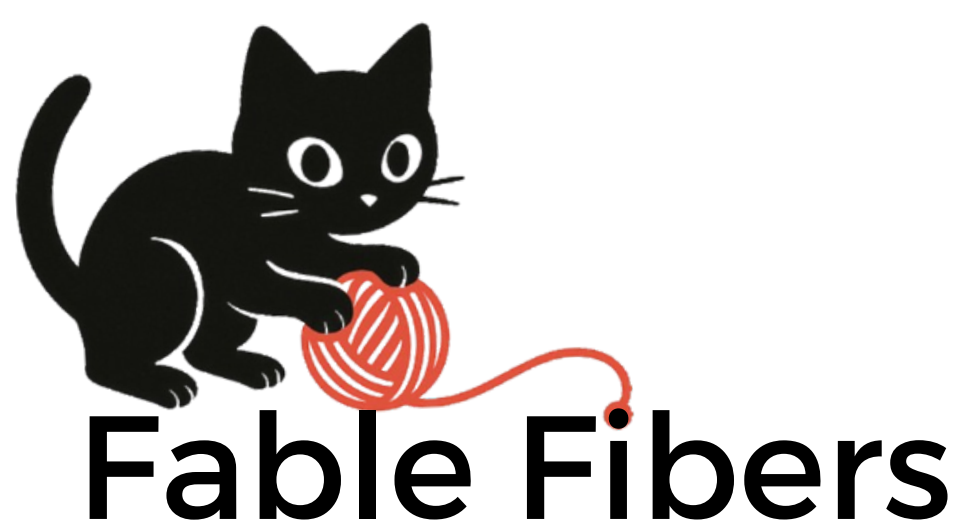
Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- st = stitch | sts = stitches
- flo = front loop only
- sl st = slipstitch
- sc = single crochet
- inc = 2 FLO sl sts in same st
- dec = sl st two stitches together in FLO

Pattern Notes

- The Sophie Hood is worked side to side, starting with slip stitches and increase sections, then transferring to slip stitches and decrease sections.
- All stitches are worked in the front loop only (FLO) unless otherwise stated.
- Scarf is fully customizable in length.
- Final edging is worked using single crochet along the sides for a clean finish.





FULL PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

This pattern is split into 10 parts

Part 1:

Start:

Ch 2 + 1 turning chain

Increase Section:

Row 1:

Starting in the second ch from hook (start like this each new row onwards) and Sl st in next 2 sts (2 sts total)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 2-5:

FLO sl st across (2 sts)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 6:

Inc in first st (2 FLO sl sts in same st),

FLO sl st in next st (3 sts total)

Ch 1, turn.

Rows 7-10:

FLO sl st across (3 sts)

Ch 1, turn

Row 11:

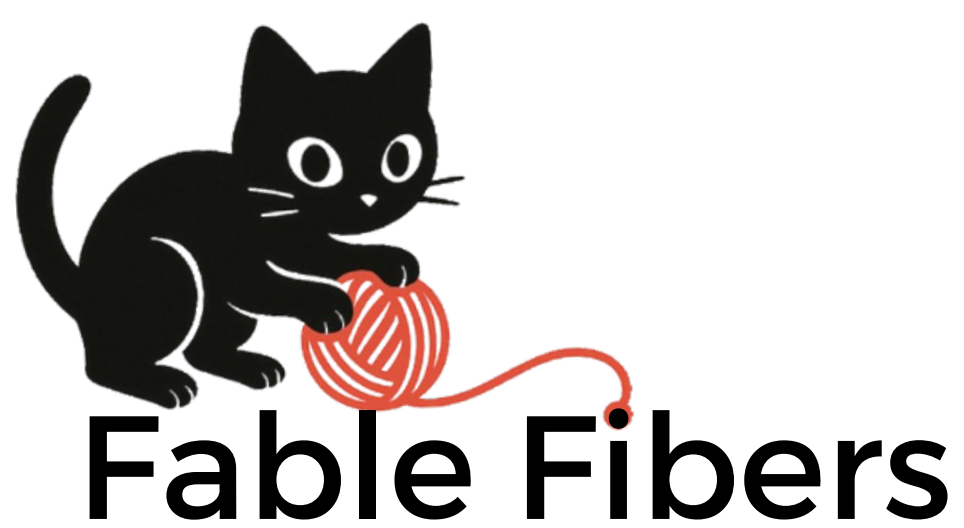
FLO sl st in first st, inc in second st ,FLO sl st in the rest st in that row.

(4 sts total)

Ch 1, turn

Rows 12-15:

FLO sl st across (4 sts)



→ Continue this pattern of increasing every 5th row until you have 42 stitches total in a row.

Each increase row should add 1 stitch by increasing into the middle stitch of that row.

(ex: if 5 st in a row, increase in the 3rd, if 8 st in a row, increase in 4th because there is no real middle.)

The length of this part is 64 cm. At the end put a stitch marker so you can measure the height of each part.

Part 2:

Once you reach 42 stitches in a row:

Continue in FLO sl st across each row,

Ch 1 and turn at the end of each row.

Repeat this for 10 cm in height. At this point you should have around 74 cm in total. Put a stitch marker again and go to Part 3.

Part 3:

We start with 42 stitches in a row

Row 1:

FLO sl st in the first 41 stitches in the row

Inc in the 42nd stitch (43 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 2-4:

FLO sl st across (43 sts)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 5:

FLO sl st in the first 42 stitches in the row

Inc in the 43rd stitch (44 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

→ Continue this pattern of increasing every 4th row in the last stitch until you have 53 stitches total in a row. ALWAYS increase on the same side of the scarf.



Fable Fibers

Part 4 :

Once you reach 53 stitches in a row:
Continue in FLO sl st across each row,
Ch 1 and turn at the end of each row.
Repeat this for 13 cm in height.

Part 5 :

We start with 53 stitches in a row

Row 1:

FLO sl st in the first 51 stitches in the row
Dec (sl st two stitches together in FLO) in the 52nd and 53rd stitch
(52 stitches in total at the end of the row)
Ch 1, turn.

Row 2:

FLO sl st across (52 sts)
Ch 1, turn.

Row 3:

FLO sl st in the first 50 stitches in the row
Dec in the 51st and 52nd stitch (51 stitches in total at the end of the row)
Ch 1, turn.

Row 4:

FLO sl st across (52 sts)
Ch 1, turn.

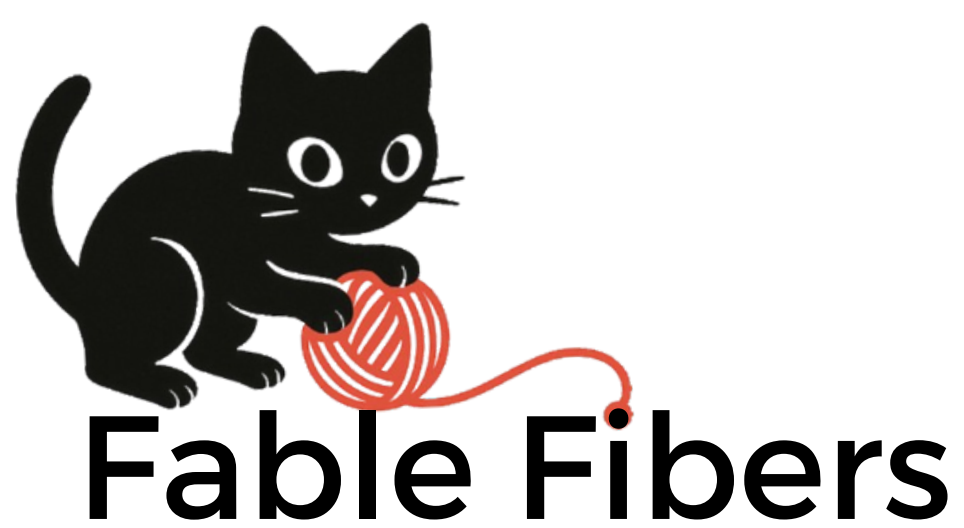
→ Continue this pattern of decreasing every 2nd row in the last stitch until you have 40 stitches total in a row.

When you reach 40 stitches in a row, do 3 more rows with:

FLO sl st across (40 sts)
Ch 1, turn.

THIS IS THE END OF THE FIRST SIDE

The Total height of the entire first side should be around 108 cm.



The Second side of the Sophie Hood is the same process as the first side but in the places when there is increase now we do decrease and vice versa. ALWAYS increase/decrease on the same side of the scarf.

Part 6 :

We start with 40 stitches in a row

Row 1:

FLO sl st in the first 39 stitches in the row

Inc in the 40th stitch (41 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 2:

FLO sl st across (41 sts)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 3:

FLO sl st in the first 40 stitches in the row

Inc in the 41st stitch (42 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 4:

FLO sl st across (42 sts)

Ch 1, turn.

→ Continue this pattern of increasing every 2nd row in the last stitch until you have 53 stitches total in a row.

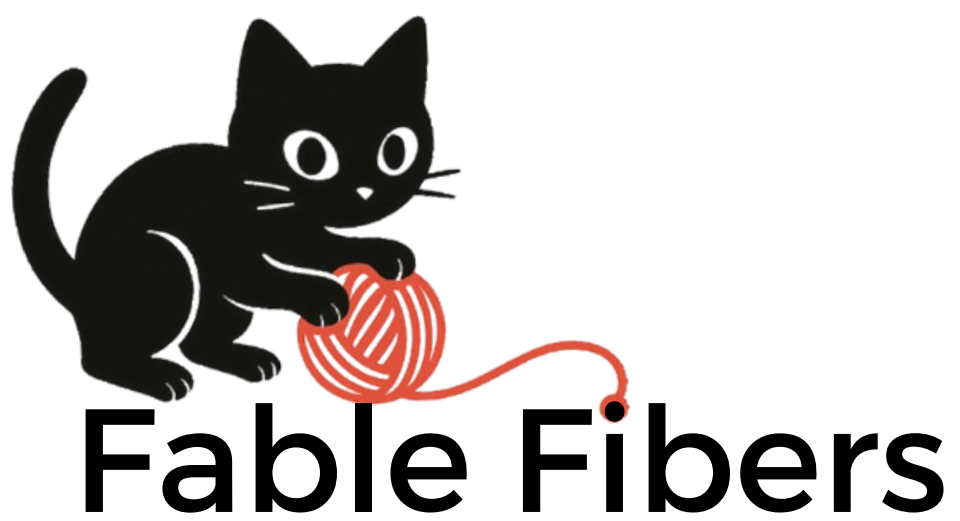
Part 7 :

Once you reach 53 stitches in a row:

Continue in FLO sl st across each row,

Ch 1 and turn at the end of each row.

Repeat this for 13 cm in height from the previous part.



Part 8 :

We start with 53 stitches in a row

Row 1:

FLO sl st in the first 51 stitches in the row

Dec in the 52nd and 53rd stitch (52 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 2-4:

FLO sl st across (52 sts)

Ch 1, turn.

Row 5:

FLO sl st in the first 50 stitches in the row

Dec in the 51st and 52nd stitch (51 stitches in total at the end of the row)

Ch 1, turn.

→ Continue this pattern of decreasing every 4th row in the last stitch until you have 42 stitches total in a row.

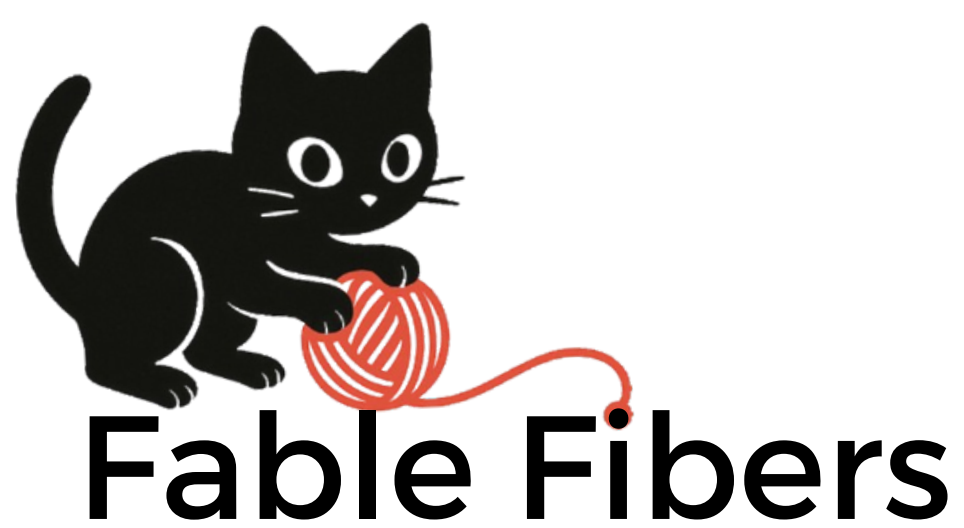
Part 9 :

Once you reach 42 stitches in a row:

Continue in FLO sl st across each row,

Ch 1 and turn at the end of each row.

Repeat this for 10 cm in height from the previous part.



Part 10:

Now begin decreasing to mirror the first increase section.

To Decrease the last part

Every 5th row, decrease by slip stitching two stitches together in FLO at the middle of the row:

Example:

Row X:

Total stitches of the row is 42 + Chain 1

FLO sl st across to the 21th stitch, dec (sl st two stitches together) in FLO stitch 22 and 23, then proceed to FLO sl st to the end of the row (41 sts)

Then work 4 more rows with slip stitches only (41 sts each).

Repeat this pattern until you're back to 2 stitches per row



Edging and Connecting of the two sides :

Once the last row has 2 stitches fasten off.

Then sew the hood sides together as shown in the picture below.
Sew together where the green line is.

You can leave out the part where the top of the hood edge is if you like the pointy look of the hood.

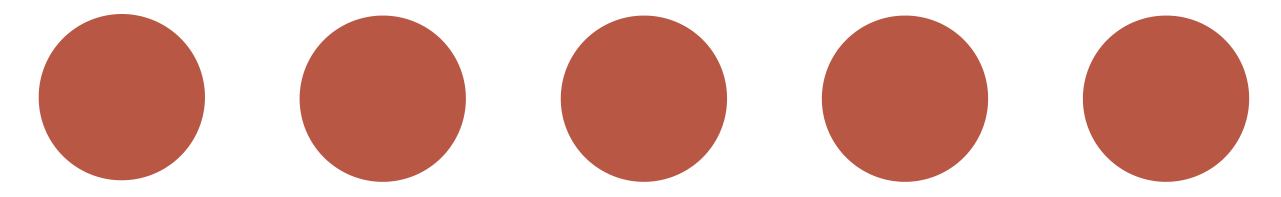


Once the hood is stitched together, proceed to work 1 sc per row edge all around the scarf for a clean structured border.

Once the border all around the scarf is done fasten off and weave in ends.

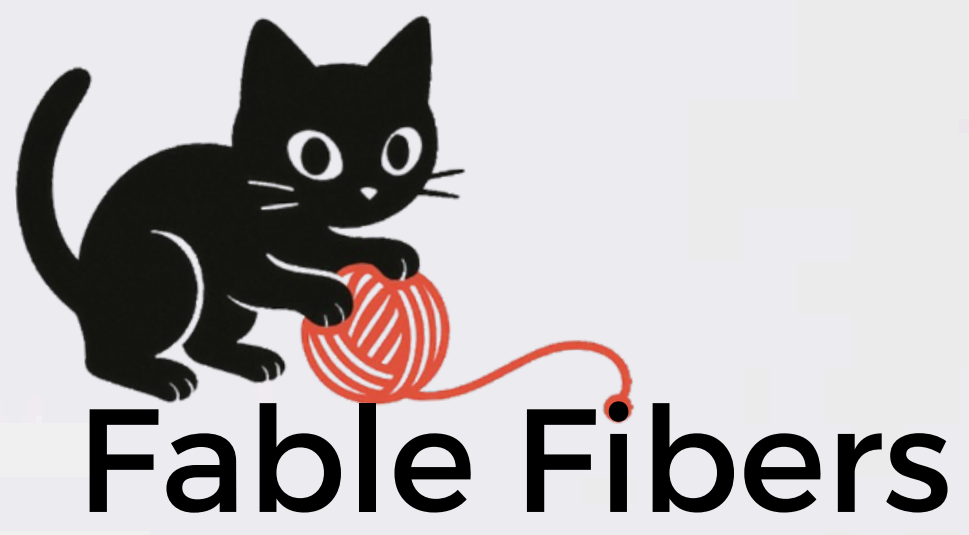
Finally turn the Hood inside out and is ready to wear !
