ATTENTION: *this crochet pattern does not contain the crochet lessons. You should have the main skills in crocheting. Skill level - intermediate.*



VARIANTS: you can make a spider with 1 pair of arms and 3 pairs of legs (*photo A*), or with 2 pairs of arms and 2 pairs of legs (*photo B*). You can see the assembly instructions for all variants on *pages 33-36*.

Also you can make a spider with only 4 or 6 limbs and it will be an unusual spider :)

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ABBREVIATIONS

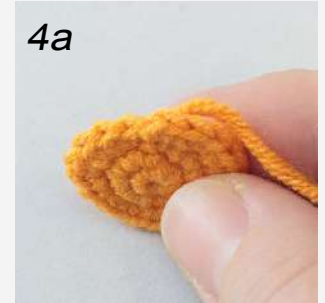
MR – magic ring
 st/lp – stitch/loop

ATTENTION:

*All the details are crocheted
 in circular rows in a spiral
 for the both loops of the stitches.
 All the exceptions are pointed
 in the description.*

*Use the marker or marker thread
 to point the end of the row.*

**FASTENING SLIP STITCH (FST SL ST)**

Fastening slip stitch - it is the same slip stitch, but it is not crocheted, but it is made with the help of a needle. Such stitch makes the end of crocheting invisible, and the edge of the detail - even, and additionally fasten well a thread.

Order of the actions:

1. Insert the end of a thread, left after crocheting the detail, in a needle.
2. Insert a needle from the front to the back for the both loops in a stitch next for the last crocheted stitch. Strain a thread (*photo 1a*).
3. Insert a needle from the front to the back in a back loop of the last crocheted stitch in a row (*photo 2a*). Again strain a thread. It is ready! (*photos 3a, 4a*).

THE LIST OF MATERIALS AND TOOLS

*This list contains the materials used to make the presented toy.
You can use other materials at your discretion.*

Yarn: for the crocheting of the toy you can use any smooth yarn of any structure, any thickness and color. All the details and accessories of the toy are crocheted with a yarn of the same thickness.

How much yarn do you need:

- the main color of the spider (head, body, nose, eyelids, arms, legs) - about 80 g (2.82 oz);
- the additional color of the spider (stripes on the body, stripe on the back) - about 30 g (1.06 oz);
- total amount of yarn for the hooded cloak - about 60 g (2.12 oz);
- amount of yarn for other details - about 10-20 g (0.35-0.70 oz) of each color.

Size of the ready toy: the height of the finished spider while standing is 28-30 cm (11.2"-11.8"), **if using the pointed yarn.**

Used yarn: cotton/acrylic yarn 160m/50g (Sport/5ply or DK/8 ply).

Color A - the main color of the spider (head, body, nose, eyelids, arms, legs) - Alize Cotton Gold №182, dark gray melange.

Color B - the additional color of the spider (stripes on the body, stripe on the back) - Alize Cotton Gold №688, brown melange.

Color C - eye pupils - Alize Cotton Gold №60, black.

Color D - iris - YarnArt Jeans №69, green.

Color E - whites of the eyes - Alize Cotton Gold №55, white.

Color F - mittens - Alize Cotton Gold №55, white.

Pumpkin boot: -----

Color G1 - boot sole - YarnArt Jeans №71, cocoa color.

Color H1 - main part of the boot - Alize Cotton Gold №83, saffron color.

Color J1 - edge of the boot sole - YarnArt Jeans №03, milk color.

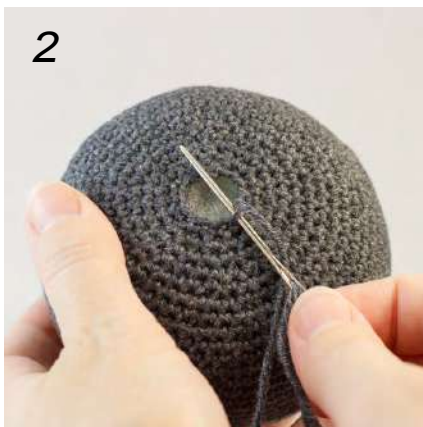

Additional materials and tools

- the hook № 1,5 (B/1) or of the other size, matching for your yarn;
- a tapestry needle with a blunt end for sewing of the details;
- a thin needle with a wide eye for embroidering;
- eyes. You need up to 9 pcs. I used the safety eyes Ø 6 mm (0.24"). You can choose the other eyes – round beads, sewing plastic halfbeads, also you can glue or embroider eyes;
- thin black and color thread for embroidering of the smiles on the spider and boots, seams on the zombie boot, and also spiderweb and spider applique on the cloak;
- pins for attaching of the details to the body;
- marker or marker thread to point the end of the row;
- scissors;
- stuffing (hollofayber).



HEAD

Crochet with a yarn of the main spider color A.
Crochet MR or 2 ch.

1 rnd: 6 sc (6 st)

2 rnd: 6 inc (12 st)

3 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*6 times (18 st)

4 rnd: 1 sc, inc, (2 sc, inc)*5 times, 1 sc (24 st)

5 rnd: (3 sc, inc)*6 times (30 st)

6 rnd: 2 sc, inc, (4 sc, inc)*5 times, 2 sc (36 st)

7 rnd: (5 sc, inc)*6 times (42 st)

8 rnd: 3 sc, inc, (6 sc, inc)*5 times, 3 sc (48 st)

9 rnd: (7 sc, inc)*6 times (54 st)

10 rnd: 4 sc, inc, (8 sc, inc)*5 times, 4 sc (60 st)

11 rnd: (9 sc, inc)*6 times (66 st)

12 rnd: 5 sc, inc, (10 sc, inc)*5 times, 5 sc (72 st)

13 rnd: (11 sc, inc)*6 times (78 st)

14-26 rnd: 13 rows - 78 sc in each row (78 st)

27 rnd: (11 sc, dec)*6 times (72 st)

28 rnd: 5 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec)*5 times, 5 sc (66 st)

29 rnd: (9 sc, dec)*6 times (60 st)

30 rnd: 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec)*5 times, 4 sc (54 st)

31 rnd: (7 sc, dec)*6 times (48 st)

32 rnd: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec)*5 times, 3 sc (42 st)

Stuff the head.

33 rnd: (5 sc, dec)*6 times (36 st)

34 rnd: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec)*5 times, 2 sc (30 st)

35 rnd: (3 sc, dec)*6 times (24 st)

36 rnd: 1 sc, dec, (2 sc, dec)*5 times, 1 sc (18 st)

Stuff the head completely.

37 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*6 times (12 st)

Crochet 1 sc, cut a thread, leaving enough thread for tightening. Tighten the left 12 stitches for the front loops only, hide the thread (*photos 2-3*). It is ready! (*photo 4*)

BODY (BEGINNING) -----

Crochet with a yarn of the main spider color A. Crochet MR or 2 ch.

- 1 rnd: 6 sc (6 st)
 2 rnd: 6 inc (12 st)
 3 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*6 times (18 st)
 4 rnd: 1 sc, inc, (2 sc, inc)*5 times, 1 sc (24 st)
 5 rnd: (3 sc, inc)*6 times (30 st)
 6 rnd: 2 sc, inc, (4 sc, inc)*5 times, 2 sc (36 st)
 7 rnd: (5 sc, inc)*6 times (42 st)
 8 rnd: 3 sc, inc, (6 sc, inc)*5 times, 3 sc (48 st)
 9 rnd: (7 sc, inc)*6 times (54 st)
 10 rnd: 4 sc, inc, (8 sc, inc)*5 times, 4 sc (60 st)
 11 rnd: (9 sc, inc)*6 times (66 st)
 12-14 rnd: 3 rows - 66 sc in each row (66 st)

 Change the yarn to the additional spider color B.
 Crochet 15th-16th rows with a yarn of the color B.

- 15-16 rnd: 2 rows - 66 sc in each row (66 st)

Change the yarn to the main spider color A.
 Crochet 17th row with a yarn of the color A.

- 17 rnd: 66 sc (66 st)

Change the yarn to the additional spider color B.
 Crochet 18th-23rd rows with a yarn of the color B.

- 18-23 rnd: 6 rows - 66 sc in each row (66 st)

 Change the yarn to the main spider color A.
 Crochet next rows with a yarn of the main color A.

- 24-27 rnd: 4 rows - 66 sc in each row (66 st)
 28 rnd: 58 sc, dec, 6 sc (65 st)
 29 rnd: 2 sc, dec, 8 sc, dec, 43 sc, dec, 6 sc (62 st)
 30 rnd: 1 sc, dec, 7 sc, dec, 43 sc, dec, 5 sc (59 st)
 31 rnd: 1 sc, dec, 6 sc, dec, 41 sc, dec, 5 sc (56 st)
 32 rnd: dec, 5 sc, dec, 47 sc (54 st)
 33 rnd: 54 sc (54 st)
 34 rnd: 8 sc, dec, (16 sc, dec)*2 times, 8 sc (51 st)

Stuff the body.



BODY (ENDING) -----

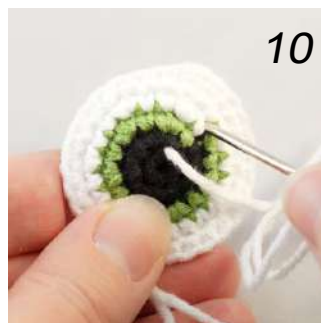
- 35 rnd: (15 sc, dec)*3 times (48 st)
 36 rnd: 7 sc, dec, (14 sc, dec)*2 times, 7 sc (45 st)
 37 rnd: (13 sc, dec)*3 times (42 st)
 38 rnd: 6 sc, dec, (12 sc, dec)*2 times, 6 sc (39 st)
 39 rnd: (11 sc, dec)*3 times (36 st)
 40-42 rnd: 3 rows - 36 sc in each row (36 st)



Crochet 1 sl st, cut a thread, leaving a long thread for sewing.
 Stuff the body completely. It is ready! (photos 5-7)

ATTENTION:

Mark the decreases of the 31st row with pins or additional markers (photo 8). The additional markers indicate of the back of the body and helps sewing the head, arms and legs symmetrically. Do not remove these markers until you finish sewing all the details to the body.

**EYES** -----

Crochet with a yarn of the eye pupils color C. Crochet MR or 2 ch.

- 1 rnd: 7 sc (7 st)
 2 rnd: 7 inc (14 st)
 Change the yarn to the iris color D.
 3 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*7 times (21 st)

Change the yarn to the color of the whites of the eyes E.

- 4 rnd: 1 sc, inc, (2 sc, inc)*6 times, 1 sc (28 st)
 5 rnd: 28 sc (28 st)



Crochet 3 sc + 1 sl st. Cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing (photo 9). Embroider the highlight on the eye with a white yarn (color E) in the place of changing the colors, as shown at the photos 10-13. It is ready! (photo 14)

EYELIDS -----

Crochet with a yarn of the main spider color A.
Crochet chain 11 ch. From the second loop from the hook
crochet along the chain: 1 sl st, 8 sc, 1 sl st (10 st).
Cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing (*photo 15*).

**NOSE** -----

Crochet with a yarn of the main spider color A.
Crochet chain 4 ch.
1 rnd: (from the second loop from the hook) inc, 1 sc, inc,
go to the second side of the chain, in the very same
loop - inc, further along the row - 1 sc, inc (10 st)
2 rnd: inc, 2 sc, 3 inc, 2 sc, 2 inc (16 st)
3 rnd: (1 sc, inc, 5 sc, inc)*2 times (20 st)
4 rnd: 4 sc, dec, 8 sc, dec, 4 sc (18 st)
Crochet 1 sl st. Cut a thread, leaving enough thread
for sewing. Stuff the nose. It is ready! (*photo 16*)

**ARMS (BEGINNING)** -----

Crochet with a yarn of the mittens color F.
Crochet MR or 2 ch.
1 rnd: 6 sc (6 st)
2 rnd: 6 inc (12 st)
3 rnd: (3 sc, inc)*3 times (15 st)
4-5 rnd: 2 rows - 15 sc in each row (15 st)
6 rnd: 7 sc, 4 hdc in one stitch, 7 sc (18 st) (*photo 17*)
7 rnd: 18 sc (18 st)
8 rnd: 8 sc, dec, 8 sc (17 st)
9 rnd: 7 sc, 2 dec, 6 sc (15 st)
10 rnd: (dec, 3 sc)*3 times (12 st) (*photo 18*)



Stuff the arm. Change the yarn to the main spider color A.
11 rnd: (for the back loops only) (2 sc, dec)*3 times (9 st)
(*photo 19*)



Further crochet for the both halfloops as usual.
In the course of crocheting stuff the arm.



ARMS (ENDING) -----

12-21 rnd: 10 rows - 9 sc in each row (9 st)

Stuff the arm.

22 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*3 times (6 st)

23 rnd: 6 sc (6 st)

24 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*3 times (9 st)

25-36 rnd: 12 rows - 9 sc in each row (9 st)

 Stuff the arm completely. For the first arm last crocheted stitch should be directly **at the front** of the arm (at one and the same level with the finger on the mitten) (*photo 20*). If it is not so, crochet the additional stitches or undo some stitches to this point.

For the second arm last crocheted stitch should be directly **at the back** of the arm (*photo 21*). If it is not so, crochet the additional stitches or undo some stitches to this point.

Fold the top of the arm in half and crochet for the both sides 3 sc + 1 sl st (*photo 22*).

Cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing.

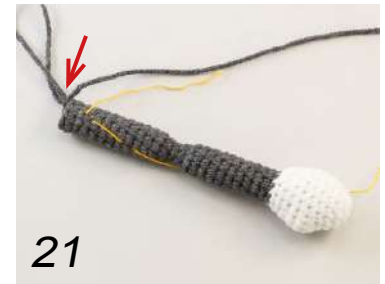
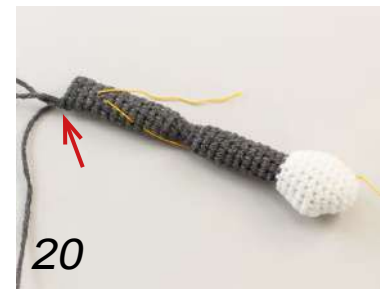
 Now it is necessary to crochet round the top of the mitten with a yarn of the color F.

Insert the hook into the first left not crocheted halfloop in the 11th row, take out a loop, crochet 1 ch, 1 sc into the same halfloop (*photo 23*), then crochet into the next free halfloops along the row: (inc, 2 sc)*3 times, inc, 1 sc (16 st).

Connect the first and last stitches of the row with the help of 1 sl st (*photo 24*).

Cut a thread, make 1 fst sl st, hide the thread (*photo 25*).

The arms are ready! (*photo 26*)

ASSEMBLY (HEAD AND BODY). BEGINNING -----

Eyes. Attach the eyes to the head with pins between the 11th and 22nd rows. The space between the inner edges of eyes is 3 stitches (*photo 27*).

Stuff the eyes a little to keep them slightly bulging (*photo 28*). I recommend to take more pins and attach the eyes as evenly as possible (*photo 29*).

Sew the eyes, fasten off and hide the thread (*photos 30-32*).

Nose. Attach the nose to the head with pins between the 19th and 25th rows. Make sure that the nose is symmetrical relatively to the eyes (*photos 33-34*).

Sew the nose. If it necessary in the process of sewing add some more stuffing in the nose. Fasten off and hide the thread. It is ready! (*photo 35*)

ASSEMBLY (HEAD AND BODY). CONTINUATION -----*Eyelids*

Attach the eyelids over the eyes with pins as shown at the *photos 36-39*. Make sure that the eyelids are placed symmetrically from the both sides.

Sew the eyelids (*photos 40-41*), fasten off and hide the thread. It is ready! (*photos 42-44*)



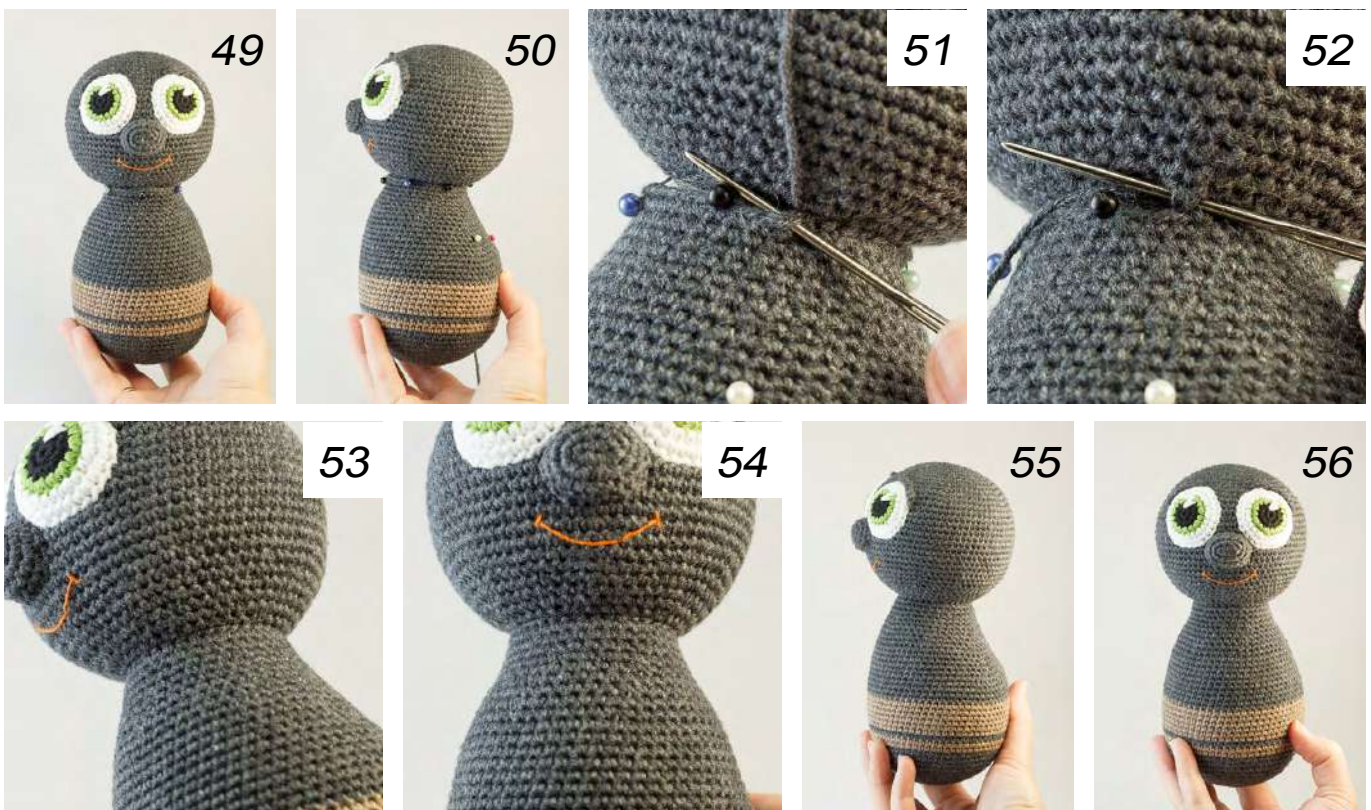


ASSEMBLY (HEAD AND BODY). ENDING -----

Smile. Embroider the smile with the thin bright thread (*photos 45-46*). You can embroider the smile differently, as you like. It is ready! (*photo 47*)

Sewing of the head and body. Attach the body to the head with pins between the 33rd and 34th rows of the head, because in this place number of stitches of the head (36 st) coincides with the number of stitches in the last row of the body (*photos 49-50*). Make sure that the head is symmetrical relatively to the additional markers on the body (*photo 48*).

Sew the body to the head, in the process of sewing stuff the body completely (*photos 51-54*). Fasten off and hide the thread. It is ready! (*photos 55-56*).

STRIPE ON THE BACK

Crochet with a yarn of the additional spider color B.
Crochet chain 36 ch.

1 rnd: (from the second loop from the hook) 15 sc, 3 hdc, 9 dc, 3 hdc, 4 sc, inc, go to the second side of the chain, in the very same loop - inc, further along the row - 4 sc, 3 hdc, 9 dc, 3 hdc, 14 sc, 1 sl st (72 st)

Cut a thread, leaving long tail of thread for sewing. It is ready! (*photo 57*)

ATTENTION: you can sew the stripe to the body now or after sewing of the legs and arms.

Attach the stripe to the body with pins along the central part of the back, beginning from the top of the body. The wider part of the stripe should be at the lower part of the body, in the place of changing the colors.

Make sure that the stripe is symmetrical relatively to the both sides of the head and body and to the additional markers (*photo 58*).

Sew the stripe (*photos 59-60*), fasten off and hide the thread.

It is ready! (*photos 61-62*)

LEGS (BEGINNING) -----

The legs and bases of all boots are crocheted under the same pattern with slight differences for zombie boot and skeleton boot. All differences are pointed in the description.

Boot sole. Crochet with a yarn of the boot sole color G (each boot has its own color G1-G6, see the page 4).

Crochet chain 8 ch.

1 rnd: (from the second loop from the hook) inc, 5 sc, inc, go to the second side of the chain, in the very same loop - inc, further along the row - 5 sc, inc (18 st)

2 rnd: inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc, 2 inc (24 st)

3 rnd: inc, 1 sc, inc, 7 sc, inc, (1 sc, inc)*2 times, 7 sc, inc, 1 sc (30 st)

4 rnd: inc, 2 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, (2 sc, inc)*2 times, 8 sc, inc, 2 sc (36 st)

Crochet 1 sc, move the marker to this point (*photo 63*).

Change the yarn to the main boot color H

(each boot has its own color H1-H6, see the page 4).

5 rnd: (for the back loops only) 36 sc (36 st) (*photo 64*)

Further crochet for the both halfloops as usual.

6 rnd: 12 sc, 12 hdc, 12 sc (36 st)

7 rnd: 11 sc, 15 hdc, 10 sc (36 st)

8 rnd: 10 sc, 17 hdc, 9 sc (36 st)

9 rnd: 13 sc, 6 dec, 9 sc, dec (29 st)

If you will use the safety eyes, it's time to attach them (if you will sew or glue the eyes to the ready boot then skip this part of the description and go to the 10th row on the next page).

ATTENTION: instructions about attaching the safety eyes for zombie boot and skeleton boot - on the next page.

Place the eyes between **the 7th and 8th rows**.

The space between the eyes is 6 stitches.

At first mark the points for the eyes with pins.

Make sure that these points are placed symmetrically from the both sides (*photo 66*).

Insert the eyes (*photo 67*).

**Instructions about attaching the safety eyes
for zombie boot and skeleton boot:**

Zombie: you need to insert only one eye into this boot.

Mark the points for two eyes with pins (you will sew the white of the eye instead of the second eye a bit later).

Make sure that these points are placed symmetrically from the both sides (photo 68). Insert the eye (photo 69).

Skeleton: you don't need to insert the eyes into this boot (you will sew the eye sockets instead of the eyes a bit later) (photo 70).

LEGS (CONTINUATION) -----

Try to crochet decreases in the 10th and 11th rows tightly to make the stuffing not visible.

ATTENTION: for zombie boot crochet the **10th row for the back loops only** (photo 73). The 11th row crochet for the both halfloops as usual. All next rows crochet according to the general description of the boots.

10 rnd: 2 sc, dec, 4 sc, 8 dec, 3 sc, dec (19 st)

Stuff the boot. If you have inserted the safety eyes, stuff the boot step by step between the eyes (photo 71).

11 rnd: 2 sc, dec, 1 sc, 6 dec, 2 sc (12 st)

Change the yarn to the main spider color A.

12 rnd: (for the back loops only) (2 sc, dec)*3 times (9 st)

(photo 72). Stuff the boot completely.

Further crochet for the both halfloops as usual.

13-26 rnd: 14 rows - 9 sc in each row (9 st)

Stuff the leg.

27 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*3 times (6 st)

28 rnd: 6 sc (6 st)

29 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*3 times (9 st)

30-42 rnd: 13 rows - 9 sc in each row (9 st)



LEGS (ENDING) -----

Stuff the leg. Fold the top of the leg in half as shown at the *photo 74*.

Last crocheted stitch should be directly **at the right side** of the leg, at the flank of the bend when the front of the boot is facing forward (*photo 74*).

If it is not so, crochet the additional stitches or undo some stitches to this point.

Crochet for the both sides 3 sc + 1 sl st.

Cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing (*photo 75*).

Now it is necessary to crochet round the edge of the boot sole with sl st for the left not crocheted halfloops in the 5th row.

Crochet with a yarn of the color J (each boot has its own color J1-J6, see the page 4).

Turn the boot by the lower side to yourself (*photo 76*).

Insert the hook into the last free halfloop in the 5th row, take out a loop (*photo 76*), further crochet into the next free halfloops along the row 36 sl st (*photos 77-78*).

Cut a thread, make 1 fst sl st, hide the thread (*photo 79*).

It is ready! (*photos 80-81*)





PUMPKIN BOOT

Bootleg. Crochet with a yarn of the main boot color H1 for the left not crocheted halfloops in the 12th row. Crochet in circular rows in a spiral.

1 rnd: insert the hook into the central back free halfloop, take out a loop, crochet 1 ch, 1 sc into the same halfloop (*photo 82*), then crochet into the next free halfloops along the row: (inc, 2 sc)*3 times, inc, 1 sc (16 st)

Place the marker.

2 rnd: 16 inc (32 st)

3 rnd: 32 sc (32 st)

Connect the first and last stitches of the row with the help of 1 sl st. Cut a thread, make 1 fst sl st, hide the thread (*photo 84*).

Form the bootleg, making it a little wavy (*photos 85-86*).



Tie for the pumpkin boot. Crochet with a yarn of the tie color K. Crochet chain 51 ch. From the second loop from the hook crochet along the chain: 12 inc, 26 sl st, 12 inc (74 st). Crochet 1 sl st in the very same last loop.

Cut and hide the thread (*photo 87*). Wind the tie around the bootleg, make a knot. Sew the tie to the boot and fasten the knot by a couple of stitches.

Twist the ends of the tie a little (*photo 88*).

Smile. Embroider the smile with the thin black thread (*photo 89*).

Your pumpkin boot is ready! (*photo 90*)



ZOMBIE BOOT (BEGINNING)

Border of the boot

Crochet with a yarn of the main boot color H2 for the left not crocheted halfloops in the 10th row.

Insert the hook into the central back free halfloop, take out a loop, crochet 1 ch, 1 sc into the same halfloop (*photo 91*), then crochet into the next free halfloops along the row 28 sc (29 st).

Connect the first and last stitches of the row with the help of 1 sl st (*photo 93*). Cut a thread, make 1 fst sl st, hide the thread (*photos 94-95*).



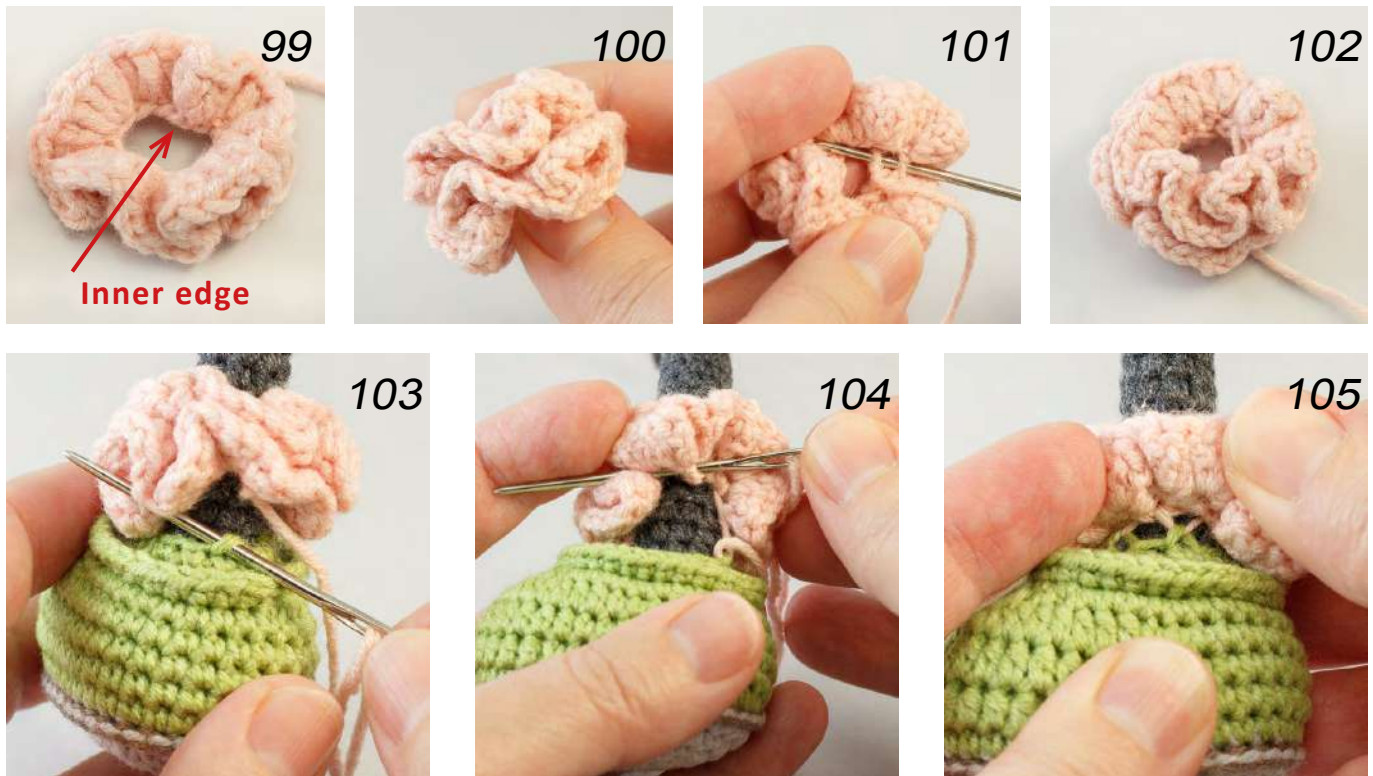
Brain (beginning)

Crochet with a yarn of the brain color L. Crochet two identical details. Leaving long tail of thread for sewing in the beginning of crocheting for the one detail.

Crochet chain 16 ch. **ATTENTION:** crochet the chain not tightly, making the loops more large than usual. Connect the chain in a ring with the help of 1 sl st (*photo 96*).

Crochet 2 ch. Crochet 4 dc in each loop of the chain (64 st) (*photo 97*). Connect the first and last stitches of the row with the help of 1 sl st. Cut a thread, fasten off and hide the thread (*photo 98*).





ZOMBIE BOOT (CONTINUATION)

Brain (ending). Fold the details together: one detail by the front side, and another detail - by the wrong side to each other (*photo 100*).

Sew the details along the inner edges for the free halfloops of the chain.

In the process of sewing tighten a thread a little, but make sure that the hole in the brain remains wide enough to put a brain on the leg (*photos 99, 101, 102*).

Put the brain on the boot. Sew the brain to the left not crocheted halfloops in the 12th row of the boot, alternately grasping halfloops of the boot and the inner edge of the brain (*photos 103-105*). In the process of sewing tighten a thread firmly so that the inner edge of the brain adjoin to the leg tightly.

This is necessary to give the brain the correct shape.

Fasten off and hide the thread.

ATTENTION:

give a more twisted shape to the convolutions (photo 106), then press the top of the brain to the leg slightly. It is ready! (photo 107)





ZOMBIE BOOT (ENDING)

White of the eye

Crochet with a yarn of the color of the white of the eye M. Crochet MR or 2 ch.
1 rnd: 8 sc (8 st)

Cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing. Make 1 fst sl st (*photo 108*)
Attach the detail to the boot with pins, sew it (*photos 109-111*).

Decoration

Embroider the smile, cross on the eye and seams with the thin black thread (*photos 112-115*). Your zombie boot is ready! (*photos 116-117*)



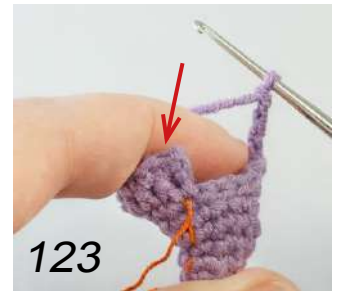

 4 rnd: 4 sc, (inc, 1 sc)*2 times (10 st)

 7 rnd: 8 sc, 4 sl st (12 st)

 Next two rows (9th and 10th) crochet in back-and-forth rows.
 Crochet 1 ch and turn the crocheting *(photo 119)*.

 Crochet 1 ch and turn the crocheting *(photo 121)*.

14 rnd: 2 sc, inc, (4 sc, inc)*5 times, 2 sc (36 st)

Crochet 2 sc, then crochet 36 sl st along the row. Cut a thread, make 1 fst sl st, hide the thread.

Embroider the buckle on the hat with a thin thread of any color contrasting relatively to the hat color (*photo 129*).

2nd curl: Crochet chain 6 ch. From the second loop from the hook crochet 5 sl st along the chain, then crochet 1 sl st into the second stitch of the base of the bangs (*photo 135*).

3rd curl: Crochet chain 5 ch. From the second loop from the hook crochet 4 sl st along the chain, then crochet 1 sl st into the third stitch of the base of the bangs (*photo 136*).

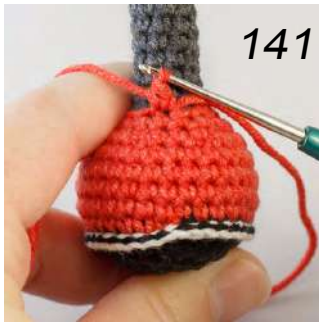
Crochet 1 ch, cut a thread, leaving enough thread for sewing (*photo 136*).

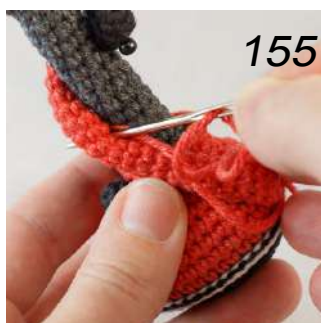

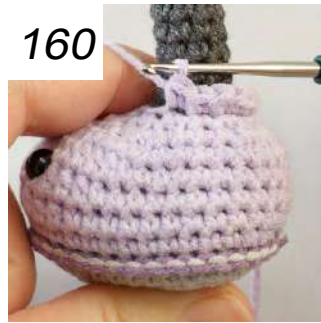

3 rnd: (3 sc, inc)*2 times (10 st)

4 rnd: 2 sc, inc, 4 sc, inc, 2 sc (12 st)

5 rnd: (2 inc, 1 sc)*4 times (20 st)

Fold the detail in half and crochet for the both sides:

in one stitch: (1 sc, 1 dc, 1 sc), 3 sl st along the row, in one stitch: (1 sc, 1 dc, 1 sc),
3 sl st along the row, in one stitch: (1 sc, 1 dc, 1 sc), 1 sl st in a stitch at the flank
of a detail (26 st) *(photos 168-171)*

Cut and hide the thread.

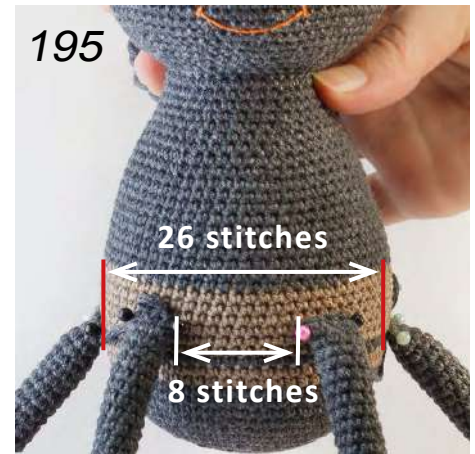

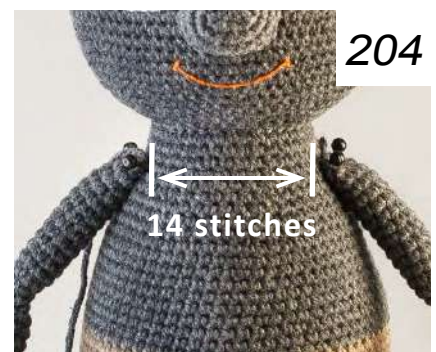

1-2 row: 2 rows - 68 dc in each row (68 st)

Change the yarn to the 2nd stripe color V.

3-5 row: 3 rows - 68 dc in each row (68 st)

Change the yarn to the main hooded cloak color W.

6-18 row: 13 rows - 68 dc in each row (68 st)

Now crochet 1 ch only, because the next row is crocheted with sc. Turn the crocheting.

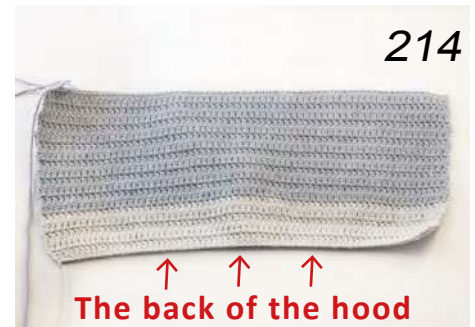

Crochet 19th-20th rows with a yarn of the color U.

19 row: 68 dc (68 st)

Now crochet 1 ch only, because the next row is crocheted with sc.

Crochet 1 sl st in the very same last loop, cut and hide the thread.

Drawstring. Crochet drawstring for the cloak with a yarn of the main cloak color W.

Crochet chain 170 ch.
