# PATTERN

## Skill Level:

- Intermediate with knowledge of amigurumi and how to color change.

## Material:

- Size G hook and Parfait Chunky Yarn I would suggest 2 balls of main color, less than half for accent
- 18in of acrylic yarn
- 24-30mm Safety Eyes (this is all a personal preference as to what you like when it comes to the eye size)
- Poly Fiber Fill
- Needle and Scissors
- Stitch marker

## Stitches/Abbreviations:

- MC – Magic Circle
- SC – Single Crochet
- HDC- Half Double Crochet
- DC- Double Crochet
- INC – Increase (2 SC in 1 ST)
- DEC – Decrease (1 SC over 2 ST)
- SL ST – Slip Stitch
- F/O – Fasten Off
- FLO- Front loop only
- BLO- Back loop only
- CH- Chain
- cc- Color change

## Notes:

- Please do not redistribute, share or sell this pattern in parts or whole. As always you may sell the finished product made from this pattern.
- Pattern is worked in the round unless otherwise stated.
- Everyone's tension is different, hook sizes are just a suggestion based off of what I use, you may need to adjust your hook size.
- I use commas to break up stitches within the same round i.e. (2sc, dec, 4sc) . Please pay attention to the commas.
- (inc)x4 means to put two stitches into each stitch four times, just like a math equation.

- When color changing, I change on the last stitch of the previous round.
  - Insert your hook with original color
  - Wrap around and pull up a loop
  - Pick up color change color, wrap around and pull through both loops on hook

## Head/Body

\*Head is worked by crocheting around the starting chain\*

R1: Ch5, starting in the 2nd ch from hook, inc, 2sc, sc4 in next ch, turn now working down the other side of the ch, 2sc, inc (12)

R2; (inc)x2, 2sc, (inc)x4, 2sc, (inc)x2 (20)

R3&4: 20sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

R5: (inc)x2, 8sc, (inc)x2, 8sc (24)

R6: 2sc, (inc, sc)x6, 10sc (30)

R7: 2sc, (inc, 2sc)x6, 10sc (36)

R8: 36sc, you may have to stitch until you are lined back up to the side.

R9: 2sc, (3sc, inc)x6, 10sc (42)

R10-I4: 42sc (for a total of 5 rounds)

R15: (5sc, dec)x6 (36)

R16: (4sc, dec)x6 (30)

R17: (3sc, dec)x6 (24)

Stop here and place eyes. The first eye should be placed after the second inc of R7. The second eye should be placed 12sc to the left. Make sure that both eyes line up with the edges of the nose. From here we will be face shaping.



### To face shape:

Stuff the head, making sure not to knock out the eyes. At this point you will be able to see if the eyes are properly placed at the edges of the nose. Make adjustments if need be. Take a piece of acrylic yarn, going in from the opening at the back of the head and coming out to the stitch right of the first eye you placed. Take the eye out and weave the yarn into the head at that stitch, then out where you placed the second eye (take the eye out). Weave in at the stitch to the left and out at the stitch to the right of the first eye. From here you will repeat weaving the yarn through all four spaces in the same pattern. Make sure that you pull tightly, but not too tight. Once you have achieved a shape that you are happy with, weave the yarn out at the opening in the back of the head and knot the yarn. From here you can place the eyes back into place and attach the safety backings. You may have to remove some stuffing to do so,



### Head/Body Continued:

RI8: (2sc, dec)x6 (I8)

RI9: (4sc, dec)x3 (I5)

R20: (4sc, inc)x3 (I8)

R2I: (2sc, inc)x6 (24) \*stuff and continue to stuff through out\*

R22: (3sc, inc)x6 (30)

R23: (4sc, inc)x6 (36)

R24-30: 36sc (for a total of 7 rounds)

R3I: (4sc, dec)x6 (30)

R32: 30sc

R33: (3sc, dec)x6 (24)

R34: 24sc, plus whatever you need to get the center of the bottom of the dragon. I had to add 2sc

R35: 6sc, (dec)x6, 6sc (I8)

R36&37: I8sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

R38: (7sc, dec)x2 (I6) \*when stuffing from here on out, stuff lightly and after every couple rounds, if you stuff the tail to firmly it wont curve for photos\*

R39&40: I6sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

R4I: (6sc, dec)x2 (I4)

R42-44: I4sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

R45: (5sc, dec)x2 (I2)



### Head/Body Continued:

R46-49: I2sc (for a total of 4 rounds)

R50: (4sc, dec)x2 (I0)

R51-55: I0sc (for a total of 5 rounds)

R56: dec, 8sc (9)

R57-61: 9sc (for a total of 5 rounds) \*depending on what yarn you are using and your tension you may not have to stuff much after this\*

R62: dec, 7sc (8)

R63-67: 8sc (for a total of 5 rounds)

R68: dec, 6sc (7)

R69-73: 7sc (for a total of 5 rounds)

R74: dec, 5sc (6)

R75-80: 6sc (for a total of 6 rounds)

F/O leaving a tail for closing. **If using scorpion tail DO NOT F/O**



### Front Legs

Starting in accent color.

R1: Mc5

R2: (inc)x5 (I0)

R3: (sc, inc)x5 \*cc to main color on last stitch\* (I5)

R4: BL0 I5sc

R5&6: I5sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

R7: (3sc, dec)x3 (I2) \*stuff up until R6\*

R8-II: I2sc (for a total of 4 rounds)

RI2: Fold flat and sc shut (6)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.



## Back Legs

Starting in accent color

RI: Ch5, starting in the 2nd ch from hook, inc, 2sc, sc4 in next ch, turn now working down the other side of the ch, 2sc, inc (I2)

R2: inc, 4sc, (inc)x2, 4sc, inc \*cc to main color on last stitch\* (I6)

R3: BL0 I6sc

R4: I6sc

R5: 4sc, (dec)x4, 4sc (I2)

R6: (dec)x6 \*Stuff foot and continue to stuff lightly\*

R7:FL0 (inc)x6 (I2)

R8: (inc)xI2 (24)

R9&I0: 24sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

R11: (dec)xI2 (I2)

R12: (dec)x6 (6)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing. Close hole.



## Spikes:

Make as many spikes as you'd like. I start by placing one between the horns and work down the body to the tip of the tail. I used any where between I0-I4, just make sure to place them evenly.

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (2sc, inc)x2 (8)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing. \*Do Not Stuff\*

## Wings: Make 2

\*ChI and turn after each row\*

R1: Ch4 in second ch from hook inc, 2sc (4)

R2: 3sc, inc (5)

R3: inc, 4sc (6)

R4: 5sc, inc (7)

R5: inc, 6sc (8)

R6: 7sc, inc (9)

R7: dec, 7sc (8)

R8: 6sc, dec (7)

R9: dec, 5sc (6)

RI0: 4sc, dec (5)

R11: dec, 3sc (4)

\*Now we will be working along the bottom side of the wing\*

RI2: in the corner: [ch3, 3hdc]all in the same st, 3sl st, 3hdc into next stitch, 3hdc into next stitch (these two clusters of hdc should be in the middle), 3sl st, 3 hdc into next stitch (this should be at the end)

\*If you are wanting to have your accent color along the top of the wing, cc and crochet along the top, making sure to put 2sc into the top point of the wing.

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.



## Attachment of the basics:

-Front Legs are attached between R23-29. You will be placing them on the dragons belly. The bottom of the dragons foot should sit close to the neck of the dragon, on both sides of the head. See pic below

-Back legs are attached between R31-35. You will only be attached the thigh portion of the back foot. See pic below.

-Spikes are attached evenly from head to tail. I place the first spike between R10-I2 at the center top of the head. I space my spikes out with a two finger spacing...its very strategic

-Wings are attached between R25-29 on either side of the spikes.

-Move onto horn options, face embellishments and tail spikes.



### Option 1 Horns: Make 2 in accent color

RI: Mc4

R2: 4sc

R3: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R4: (sc, inc)x3 (9)

R5: (inc)x3, (dec)x3 (9)

R6: (sc, inc)x3, 3sc (I2)

R7: I2sc

Stuff lightly. F/O leaving a tail for sewing



### Option 2 Horns: Make 2 in accent color

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (2sc, inc)x2 (8)

R4: (3sc, inc)x2 (I0)

R5: (4sc, inc)x2 (I2)

R6-8: I2sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

R9: (dec)x6 (6) \*stuff\*

F/O leaving a tail for sewing



Horn attachment: Horns are attached between RI2-I4 of the head

Option 3 Horns: Make 2 in accent color

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (2sc, inc)x2 (8)

R4: (3sc, inc)x2 (10)

R5: (4sc, inc)x2 (12)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing



Horn attachment: Horns are attached between RI2-I4 of the head

## Ears: Make 2

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: 6sc

R4: (inc)x6 (12)

R5: (sc, inc)x6 (18)

R6-8: 18sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

R9: (sc, dec)x6 (12)

RI0: Fold flat 6sc across \*working through both sides\*

RII: Fold in half 2sc across \*Working through both sides\*

F/O leaving a tail for sewing. \*Do Not Stuff\*

Ear attachment: Ears are attached between RI2-I4 directly under the horns.



## Face Embellishments: Option 1

Piece A: Make 4

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (2sc, inc)x2 (8)

R4: 8sc

F/O leaving a tail for sewing

Piece B: Make 2

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (2sc, inc)x2 (8)

R4-6: 8sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.



Take two piece A and one piece B. Putting piece B in between the A pieces. Stitch them together like shown in the picture. Follow these steps twice to create two side spikes and attach them on either side of the head.

## Face Embellishments: Option 2

Make 4: 2 in spike color, 2 in accent color

RI: Mc4

R2: (sc, inc)x2 (6)

R3: (inc)x6 (I2)

R4&5: I2sc (for a total of 2 rounds)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing. \*Do Not Stuff\*



### Face Embellishments: Option 3

Starting with Main Color

R1: Ch7, in the 2nd ch from hook, 6sc, \*cc to accent color\*, ch1 and turn

R2: 6sc, ch2 and turn

R3: Starting in 2nd ch from hook 7sc, ch 1 and turn

R4: 6sc, ch2 and turn

R5: Starting in 2nd ch from hook 7sc, ch 1 and turn

R6: 6sc, ch2 and turn

R7: Starting in 2nd ch from hook 7sc, ch 1 and turn

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.



Face embellishments attachment: Any face embellishments are placed aligned with horns between r12-I4. Making sure to keep the spacing as even as possible.

Tail Spike Option 1: Make 2 \*Spike Tail\*

RI: Mc4

R2; (sc,inc)x2 (6)

R3: (inc)x6 (I2)

R4&5: I2sc

R6: (dec)x6 (6)

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.

Attach to end of tail with both pieces sitting side by side.



Tail Spike Option 2: Make 1 \*Arrow Tail\*

RI: Mc4

R2; (sc,inc)x2 (6)

R3: (inc)x6 (I2)

R4: (sc, inc)x6 (I8)

R5: I8sc

R6: Fold flat, ch2, working through both sides dc, ch2 sl st in 2nd ch from hook, working back into the same space, dc, sl st in the next 2, now working in the front side only place 3sl st. Working through both sides place 2 sl st, dc, ch2 sl st in 2nd ch from hook, dc back into same space, ch 2 sl st into same space.

F/O leaving a tail for sewing. Attach by placing the tail through the hole and sewing it onto the dragon.



### Tail Spike Option 3: Make I \*Dagger Tail\*

R1: Mc4

R2: (sc,inc)x2 (6)

R3: (inc)x6 (12)

R4-6: I2sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

R7: (sc, inc)x6 (18)

R8: I8sc

R9: Fold flat, working through both layers, 3sc, 3 sl st through layer closest to you, continue to work through both layers 3sc

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.

Attach by placing the end of the tail into the hole left by sl st in the single layer of the tail. Secure to tail using tail.



### Tail Spike Option 4: \*Feathered Tail\*

Small Feathers: Make 4

RI: Ch7 starting in the 2nd ch from hook: inc, sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc now ch2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc back into the same ch space, turn and working down the other side of the chain: hdc, dc, hdc, sc, inc

F/O leaving a tail for sewing.

Large Feather: Make 1

RI: Ch9 starting in the 2nd ch from hook: inc, sc, hdc, dc, dc, hdc, sc, sc now ch2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc back into the same ch space, turn and working down the other side of the chain: sc, hdc, dc, dc, hdc, sc, inc  
F/O leaving a tail for sewing.

Attach by placing 2 small feathers on the sides of the tip of the tail, and the large feather at the very tip of the tail. I count 2 rows down from the tip and place 1 small on each side, then moving up towards the tip I place 2 more smalls (one on each side), then I attach the large feather. This gives the layered look.



Tail Spike Option 5: Make I \*Scorpion Tail\*

\*Continue from the tail of the dragon\*

R1: FLO (sc,inc)x3 (9)

R2: (2sc, inc)x3 (I2)

R3-5: I2sc (for a total of 3 rounds)

R6: (dec)x6 (6) \*stuff this portion of the tail\*

R7: (sc, dec)x2 (4)

R8: 4sc

F/O leaving a tail, close the hole.
