*Hello friend!*

If you're reading this, then you're ready to create your own *Cuddly Nessie Monster!* And I'm here to help you! This is not just a pattern. This is a learning journey. That's why I decided to call it a pattern-learning.

Although this is my first experience. Honestly, I don't know how to create patterns correctly. *But I want to share my experience, skills and techniques of working with fluffy yarn!*

So I wrote this pattern the way I think it is right, the way I would like to learn how to create something myself. I was guided by my inner feelings.

I hope you understand that you will need to be patient to yourself, because creating a Nessie Monster is not a quick process, but it is incredibly interesting! And remember that you can return to this pattern even after some time. That is the sense of the pattern-learning!

You may not get it right the first time (I never do!). So if something doesn't work out, *thank yourself for your efforts and try again!*

Have you got your hook and fluffy yarn READY? So let's go together on an unforgettable journey of creating Cuddly Nessie Monster!

*p.s.: I have invested a lot of energy in this pattern- learning, so I also hope that you will respect my efforts! So please do not share this pattern for free! Do not resell the pattern! And do not copy it! THANK YOU!*

# MATERIALS

1. Hooks: 4.5 - for crocheting all the details and 2.5 - to hide the ends of yarn in all details.

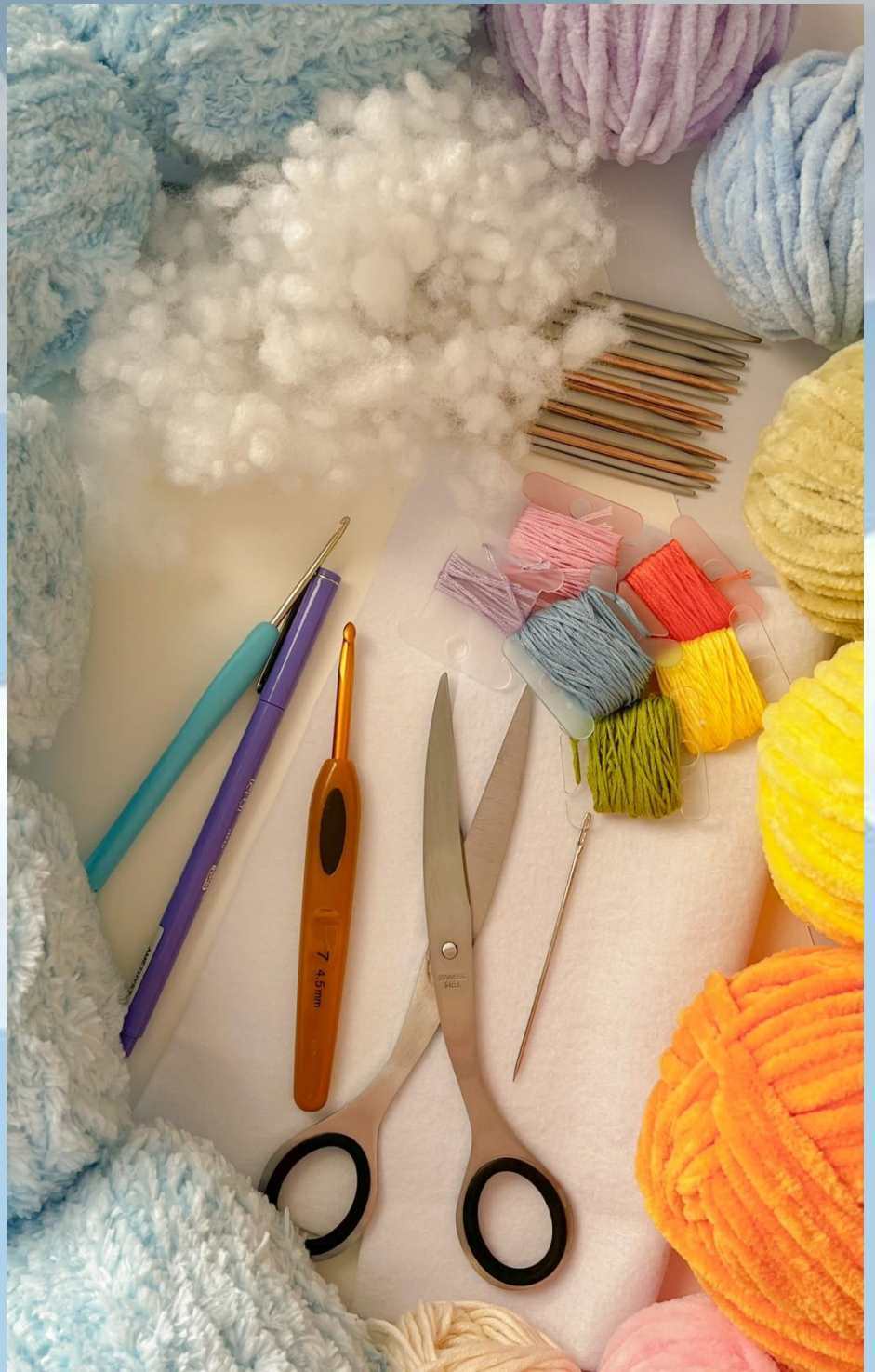
2. 4-5 skeins of fluffy yarn in the color you want (Himalaya Koala, YarnArt Fable Fur, Koala Baby

Premium Yarns,

Premier Yarns Little Bunny).

3. Hollow fiber (stuffing for toys).

4. Sharp scissors for cutting out felt details and one more scissors for other processes.



5. White felt for cloud details (at least two sheets of felt in A4 format).
6. White thread for felt clouds.
7. Sewing pins for attaching felt clouds to a crocheted body.
8. 6 colors of plush yarn for the rainbow tail detail AND rainbow horns.
9. Cotton thread - to sew the rainbow detail on the tail.
10. Toothbrush - to make your Monster fluffier.
11. A few contrasting threads (to mark the beginning of the row and to see the shape of the Monster).
12. Threads in 6 colors of the rainbow for embroidering the eyes.
13. Tapestry needle for sewing all the crocheted details.
14. Small needle for sewing felt clouds.
15. Washable marker - for transferring pattern clouds onto felt.
16. Cardboard - for printing or drawing a cloud pattern.
17. Knitting needles for easy sewing of crocheted parts.

## IMPORTANT TO READ

I created this pattern to *learn how to crochet Nessie with fluffy yarn*. In this pattern, I shared my tips and secrets for working with *fluffy yarn*. A lot of video content here is for crocheting with *fluffy yarn*. But you can certainly try crocheting with *other plush yarns*. The only thing is to choose the right hook size for yourself. And understand that the look of the Nessie Monster crocheted with *fluffy yarn* and crocheted with *other yarn* will be different.

I recommend you to be patient to yourself, sometimes take a break and take your time! And I promise that I will carefully and gently guide you through this learning process!

## CROCHET PART

Head - Neck - Body - Tail

(all this will be crocheted as one detail)

*Start crocheting the head (muzzle).*

1 row: 2 ch, in the second chain from the hook - 8 sc (8)

or

1 row: 8 sc in mr (8)

### IMPORTANT

I do it this way because it's more comfortable with fluffy yarn. You can do it the way you know how to crochet.

But from now in the pattern I will write like this - 2 ch, in the second chain from the hook ... sc. BUT it' s the same that ... sc in mr.

So here we use a thread of a contrasting color (next - thread-marker) to mark the beginning of the row.



**Advice/tip/secret from me**

- *WHY WE USE CONTRASTING THREAD-MARKER?*
- Because such thread markers are comfortable to use while crocheting with fluffy yarn!

2 row: 8 inc (16)

3 row: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 8 (24)

4 row: 24 sc (24)

5 row: (5 sc, 1 inc) x 4 (28)

6-7 rows (2 rows): 28 sc (28)



**Advice/tip/secret from me**

ATTENTION

Here you need to ready 4 more threads - markers!

- Why are we going to do this?
- So that we can see the shape of the Monster's muzzle!

8 row: mark the beginning of the row with contrasting thread - (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3, here we put one more thread-marker - 8 sc, here we put the third thread-marker - (1 inc, 1 sc) x 3, here we put the last thread-marker then - 8 inc (42)

*So we have a total of 4 thread-markers in this row*

*Please watch this video carefully several times, as we will be doing this with thread-markers several times in the process of creating a Monster!*

9 row: 42 sc (42)

10 row: mark the beginning of the row with first thread-marker (1 inc, 2 sc) x 3, here second thread-marker - 8 sc, here third thread-marker - (2 sc, 1 inc) x 3, and the last thread-marker - 1 inc, 6 sc, 2 inc, 6 sc, 1 inc (52)

11-16 row (6 rows): 52 sc (52)

#### IMPORTANT

THIS is what we will do throughout the crocheting of our Monster!

AT what stages of crocheting a detail

I will stretch it - I will definitely write about it!

17 row: (1 dec, 2 sc) x 3, 8 sc, (2 sc, 1 dec) x 3, 1 dec, 6 sc, 2 dec, 6 sc, 1 dec (42)

18 row: (5 sc, 1 dec) x 6 (36)

19 row: 2 sc, 1 dec, (4 sc, 1 dec) x 5, 2 sc (30)

20 row: 4 sc, 1 dec (8 sc, 1 dec) x 2, 4 sc (27)

21 row: (7 sc, 1 dec) x 3 (24)

*stretch the detail and fill a little bit*

*spread the hollow fiber evenly*

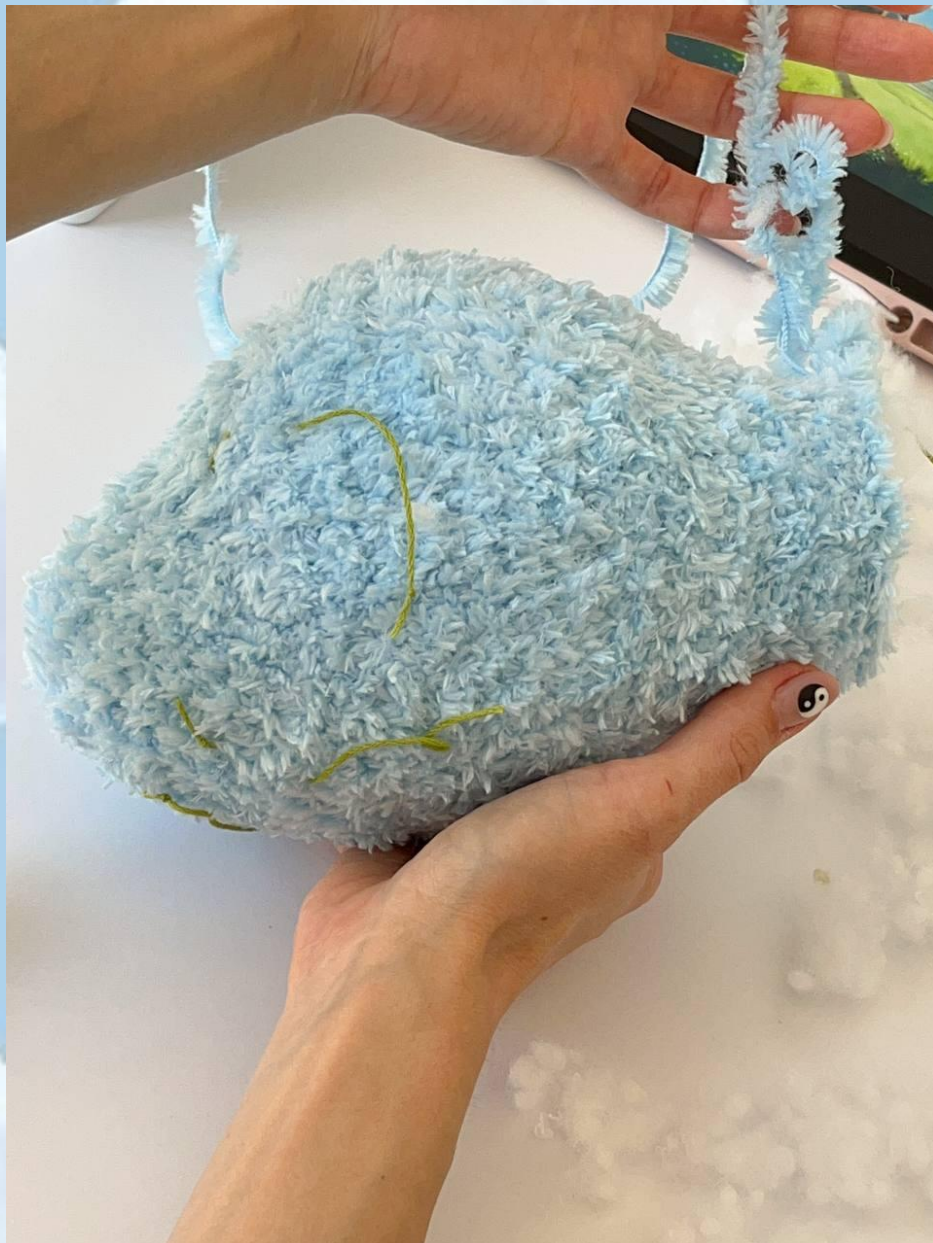

37- 41 rows (5 rows): 24 sc (24)

*stretch the detail a little*

*fill*

*spread the hollow fiber evenly*

42 row: (5 sc, 1 inc) x 4 (28)

43 row: 28 sc (28)

44 row: (6 sc, 1 inc) x 4 (32)

*Start crocheting the body*



### Advice/tip/secret from me

#### ATTENTION

Now we will **change the place of the beginning of the row!** Why are we doing this? Because the beginning of the row always moves when we crochet!  
And we have to see the shape of the Monster correctly when crocheting!

*So NOW we will move the thread-marker of the beginning of the row! It's not that complicated.  
It just might be a little strange and unusual...*

45 row: 3 sc, now there is a new beginning of the row -  
put a thread-marker here, 1 inc, 3 sc, 1 inc, here we put one  
more thread-marker - 10 sc, here we put the third thread-  
marker - 1 inc, 3 sc, 1 inc, here we put the last thread -  
marker - 1 inc, 10 sc, 1 inc (38)

*And how our detail looks like now*



46 row: 30 sc, 2 inc, 6 sc (40)

47 row: 1 inc, 22 sc, 1 inc, 7 sc, 2 inc, 7 sc (44)

48 row: 1 inc, 5 sc, 2 inc, 10 sc, 2 inc, 5 sc, 2 inc, 2 sc, 1 inc,  
2 sc, 1 inc, 4 sc, 1 inc, 2 sc, 1 inc, 2 sc, 1 inc (56)

49 row: 56 sc (56)

50 row: 1 inc, 7 sc, 2 inc, 12 sc, 2 inc, 7 sc, 2 inc, 22 sc, 1 inc

*Here I ended up with the first skein of fluffy yarn*

51 - 54 rows (4 rows): 64 (64)

55 row: 1 inc, 9 sc, 2 inc, 14 sc, 2 inc, 9 sc, 1 inc, 26 sc (70)

56 - 65 rows (10 rows): 70 sc (70)

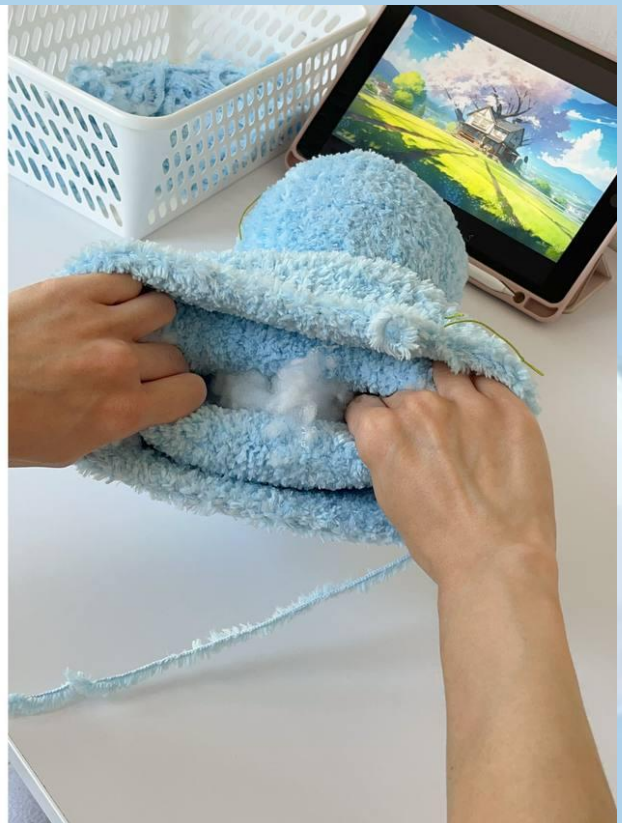

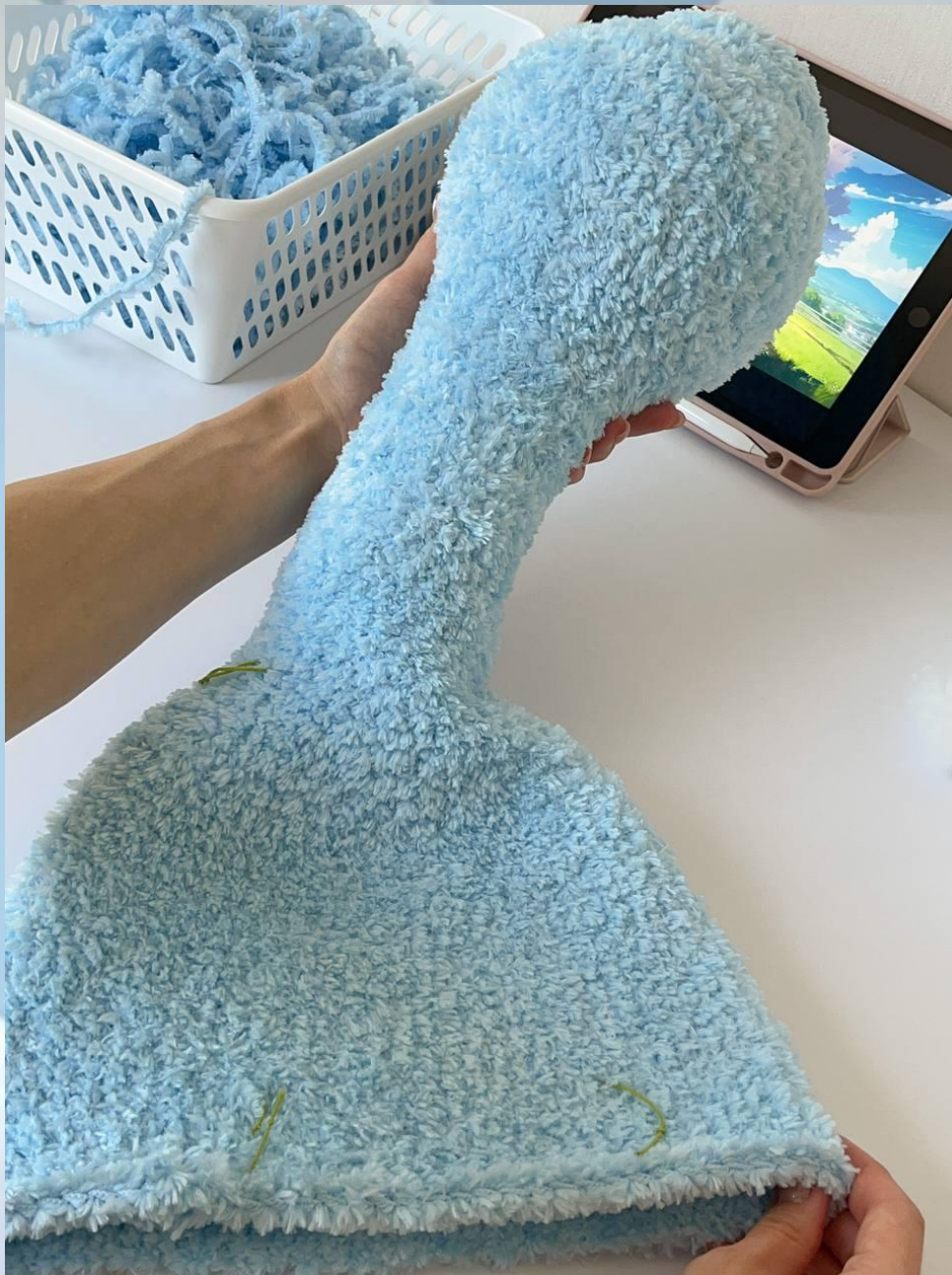

*Here we ended up with the second skein of fluffy yarn!*

*From now we will decrease the body of the Monster.*

You can fill in the neck a bit at the intersection with the body!

(70)

74 row: 70 sc (70)

75 row: 1 dec, 9 sc, 1 dec, 16 sc, 1 dec, 9 sc, 2 dec, 24 sc,

76 row: 64 sc (64)

77 row: 1 dec, 7 sc, 1 dec, 16 sc, 1 dec, 7 sc, 1 dec, 26 sc (60)

78 row: 60 sc (60)

80 row: (4 sc, 1 dec) x 9 (45)

### **Advice/tip/secret from me**

First, we fill the Monster's body with stuffing.

THEN we add stuffing from all sides.

WE TWIST the Monster's body and add stuffing to the sides.

AGAIN, one of the most important thing is to spread the stuffing evenly! Press down on the Nessie's body with your hands or fists.

STUFF the sides again if there are any empty spaces.

AND FINALLY, ANOTHER SECRET OF MY PERFECT MONSTERS SHAPE MADE OF FLUFFY YARN! Firstly - take the tapestry needle! And use the needle to smooth out the stuffing from the outside.

**IMPORTANT!**

*do not fill the body completely*

*don't fill it too tightly*

83 row: 24 sc, 4 dec, 2 sc (30)

84 row: 4 sc, 1 dec, 16 sc, 3 dec, 2 sc (26)

85 row: 1 dec, 18 sc, 1 dec, 4 sc (24)

87 row: 2 dec, 10 sc, 2 dec, 6 sc (20)

*stretch and fill (not completely)*

*spread the hollow fiber evenly*

*also here we start crocheting the tail*

88 row: 18 sc, 1 dec (19)

89 row: 17 sc, 1 dec (18)

90 row: 16 sc, 1 dec (17)

91 row: 15 sc, 1 dec (16)

*stretch and fill more (here we fill the Monster's back fully)*

92 - 95 rows (4 rows): 16 sc (16)

stretch and fill a bit

96 - 99 (4 rows): 16 sc (16)

*stretch and fill a bit*

100 row: 14 sc, 1 dec (15)

101 row: 15 sc (15)

102 row: 13 sc, 1 dec (14)

*stretch and fill a bit*

103 -107 rows (5 rows): 14 sc (14)

*stretch and fill a bit*

108 - 112 rows (5 rows): 14 sc (14)

*stretch and fill a bit*

113 row: 12 sc, 1 dec (13)

114 row: 13 sc (13)

115 row: 11 sc, 1 dec (12)

116-117 rows (2 rows): 12 sc (12)

*stretch and fill a bit*

118 - 121 rows (4 rows): 12 sc (12)

*stretch and fill a bit*

122 row: (4 sc, 1 dec) x 2 (10)

123 row: 10 sc (10)

124 row: (3 sc, 1 dec) x 2 (8)

*fill a bit*

125 row: 8 sc (8)

*pull out our fluffy thread and leave the long end of the fluffy thread*

*close and hide the loose ends*

## Fins (make 4 details)

1 row: 2 ch, in the second chain from hook 6 sc (6)

2 row: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (9)

3 row: (2 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (12)

4 row: (3 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (15)

5 row: (4 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (18)

6 row: (5 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (21)

7 row: (6 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (24)

8 row: (7 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (27)

9 row: (8 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (30)

*stretch the detail a little bit*

10 - 15 rows (6 rows): 30 sc (30)

*stretch the detail a little bit*

16 row: 3 dec, 24 sc (27)

17 row: 1 dec, 25 sc (26)

18 row: 1 dec, 24 sc (25)

19 row: 1 dec, 23 sc (24)

20 row: (10 sc, 1 dec) x 2 (22)

21 row: 22 sc (22)

22 row: 1 sc

*We do not fill fins!*

*Fold the detail in half and crochet 11 sc across to close the fins.*

HOW? - Hook in the first loop and the last loop. This is the first sc. Next, hook into the second loop and before the last loop. This is the second sc. And so on with all loops. In total, there should be 11 sc that will crochet the fin in half.

When we finish crocheting all 11 single stitches, then we just pull out our fluffy thread! And leave the long end of the thread to sew this detail to the body of the Monster.

## Ears (2 details)

### *Left ear*

1 row: 12 ch, start crocheting into the second chain from the hook - sc across next 10 ch, insert 4 sc in last ch (4 sc in the last ch), bringing you around to other side of the ch with a row of unworked loops, 10 sc on the opposite side.

*Place contrast thread-marker at the beginning of the row.*

2 row: 1 inc, 5 sc, (1 inc, 1 sc) x 4, 10 sc (29)

3 row: 1 sc, 1 inc, 8 sc, 6 inc, 13 sc (36)

4 row: 2 sc, 1 inc, 33 sc (37)

*Pull out our fluffy thread! And leave the long end of the thread to sew this detail to the head of the Monster.*

### *Right ear*

1 row: 12 ch, start crocheting into the second chain from the hook- sc across next 10 ch, insert 4 sc in last ch (4 sc in the last ch), bringing you around to other side of the ch with a row of unworked loops, 10 sc on the opposite side.

*Place thread-marker at the beginning of the row.*

2 row: 10 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) x 4, 5 sc, 1 inc (29)

3 row: 13 sc, 6 inc, 8 sc, 1 inc, 1 sc (36)

4 row: 33 sc, 1 inc, 2 sc (37)

*Pull out our fluffy thread! And leave the long end of the thread to sew this detail to the head of the Monster.*

*And how Nessie' s ears look like*



## Rainbow horns

*Here we need 6 colors of plush yarn*

*pink, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple!*

*And we need to crochet 3 horns of each color.*

*There will be 18 horn details in total.*

*SO let's turn this - into this TOGETHER!*



1 row: 2 ch, in the second chain from hook 6 sc (6)

2 row: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 3 (9)

3 row: 9 sc (9)

Pull the end of the thread inside the detail. Turn it out. Tighten the thread of the beginning. Turn it out again. Hide all the threads inside. Fill it a little. Maybe it sounds a little confusing? Or not?

### Rainbow detail

Honestly, it was very difficult for me to explain how I crocheted it! But I really hope I can explain it clearly!

*After the description of crocheting rainbow detail on tail there will be a video where I will show everything. After watching the video everything will be clearer!*

Rainbow detail will be crocheted with back-and-forth-rows.

*We start with pink colour!*

1 row: 21 ch - start crocheting from the second chain from the hook - 5 sc, 5 hdc, 5 dc, 5 tr, 1 ch, turn the crochet,  
flo - 20 sc, change colour to orange, 1 ch, turn the crochet  
2 row: blo - 5 sc, 5 hdc, 5 dc, 5 tr, 1 ch, turn the crochet,  
flo - 20 sc, change colour to yellow, 1 ch, turn the crochet  
3 row: blo - 5 sc, 5 hdc, 5 dc, 5 tr, 1 ch, turn the crochet,  
flo - 20 sc, change colour to green, 1 ch, turn the crochet  
4 row: blo - 5 sc, 5 hdc, 5 dc, 5 tr, 1 ch, turn the crochet,  
flo - 20 sc, change colour to blue, 1 ch, turn the crochet  
5 row: blo - 5 sc, 5 hdc, 5 dc, 5 tr, 1 ch, turn the crochet,  
flo - 20 sc, change colour to purple.

*Finish crocheting, cut the purple thread.*

### **Advice/tip/secret from me**

*Knitting needles help me sew on all the details. I use the knitting needles to attach the details to the crocheted body of all my Cuddly Monsters! There is nothing complicated. I attach the fins at the height I want and at the distance I want. Firstly, the front fins and then the back fins!*

The most important thing here is to look from different sides. This way we can see if we have attached all 4 fins evenly. I look from the top, front, sides, and even behind the body. Looking from different sides helps me to attach the details evenly.

*Here we look from different sides when we attach the fins to the Monster's body. What it looks like through my eyes!*



When we placed all 4 fins evenly, we sew them on the way we want them. Sew each fin on one side and from the bottom side.

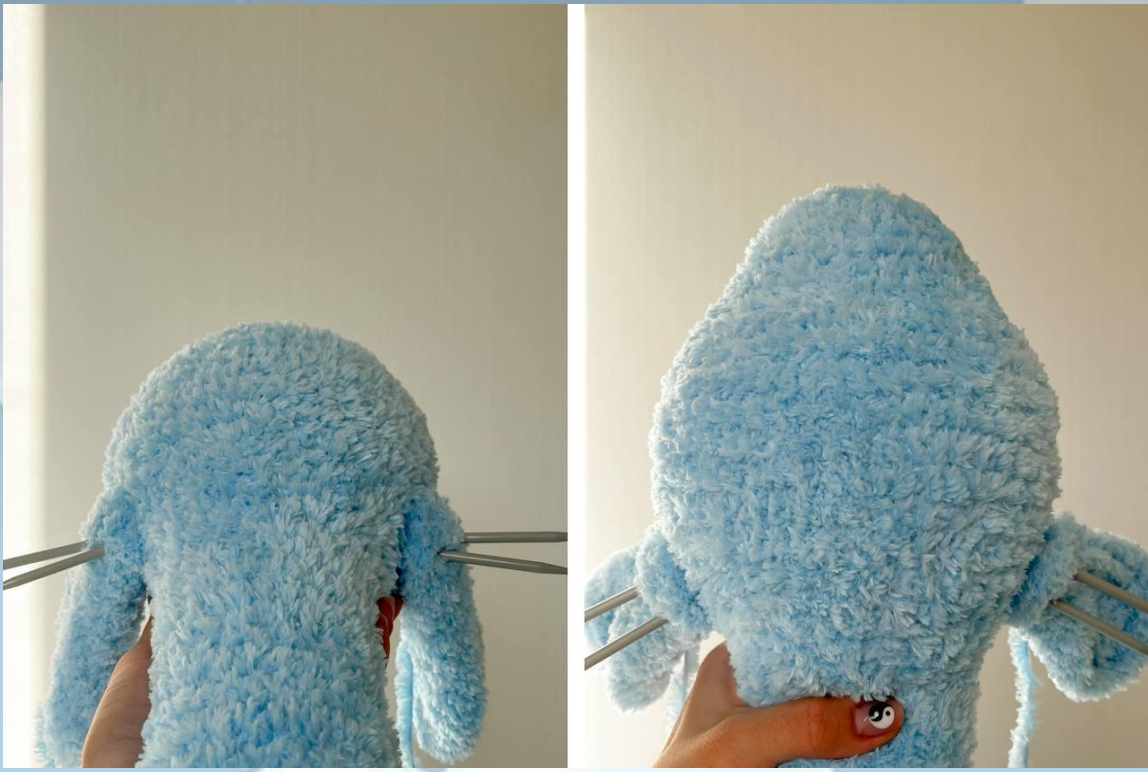

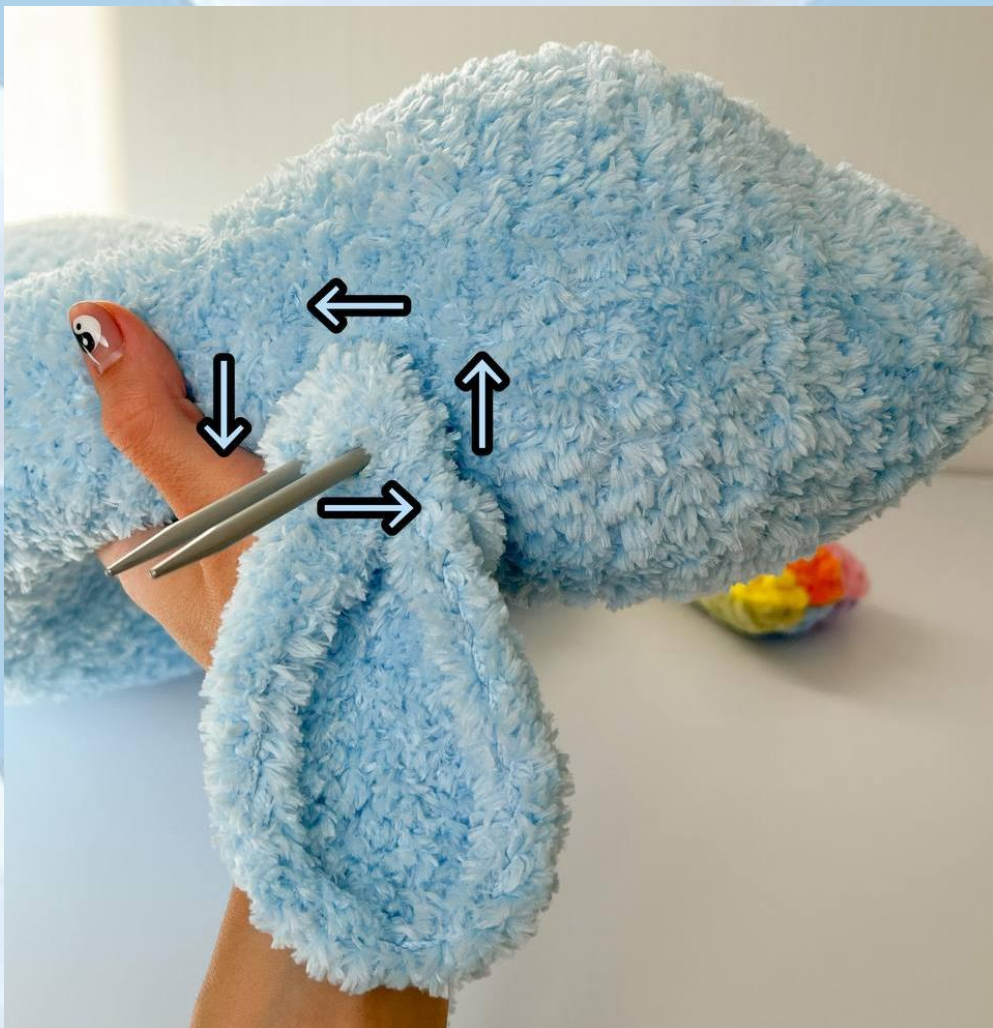
### ATTENTION!

So we have the left and right ears of the Monster. Left and right are when you look at the front of the Monster's head (muzzle).

1. We attach the ears with knitting needles in the same way as the fins! We also look at ears from different sides (photos below).



2. Then we sew the ear in a circle. One side, now the top, the other side, now the bottom.

## RAINBOW HORNS

Get ready all the rainbow horns and all the knitting needles you have (or even long needles). I use everything I have. We attach the colors in turn: pink - orange - yellow - green - blue - purple at a distance of about 3 cm (1.2 inch) from each other (as shown in the photo below). And then sew with cotton thread.

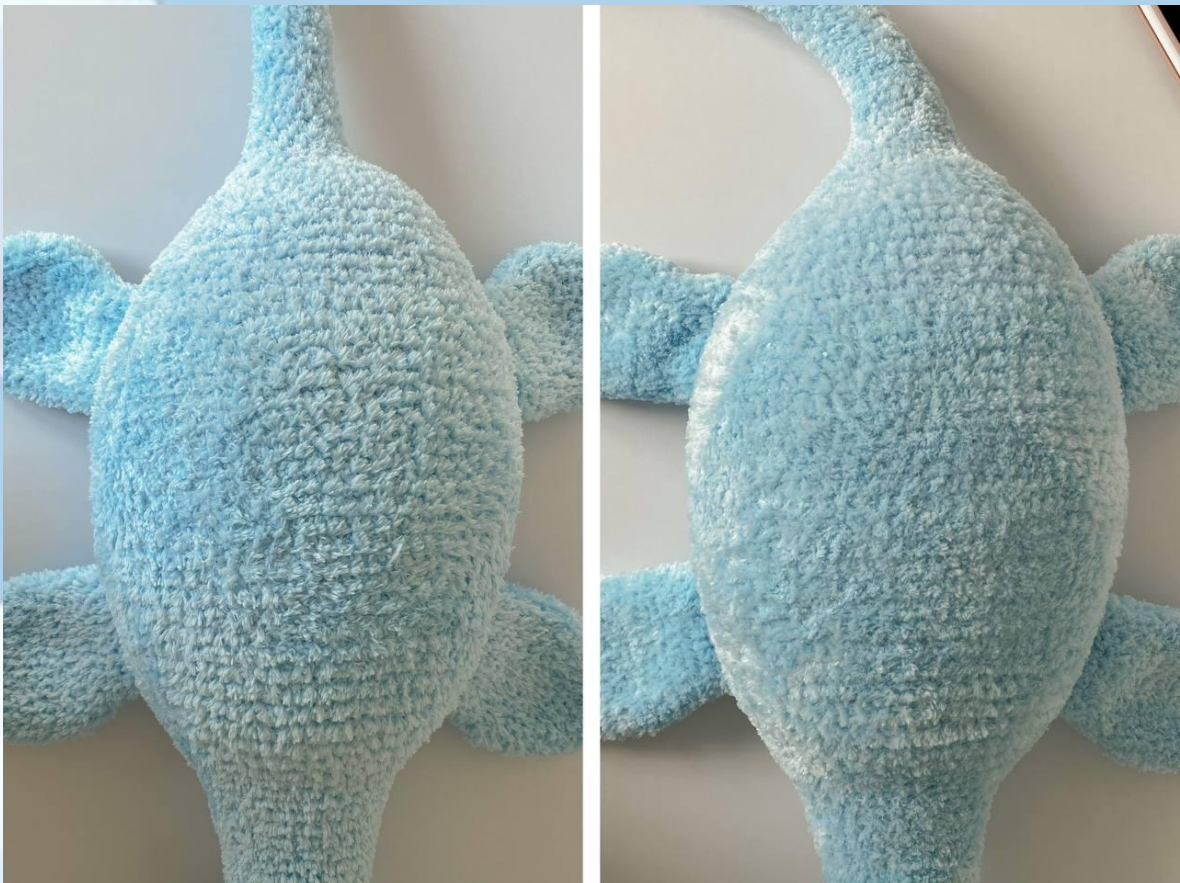

**Advice/tip/secret from me**

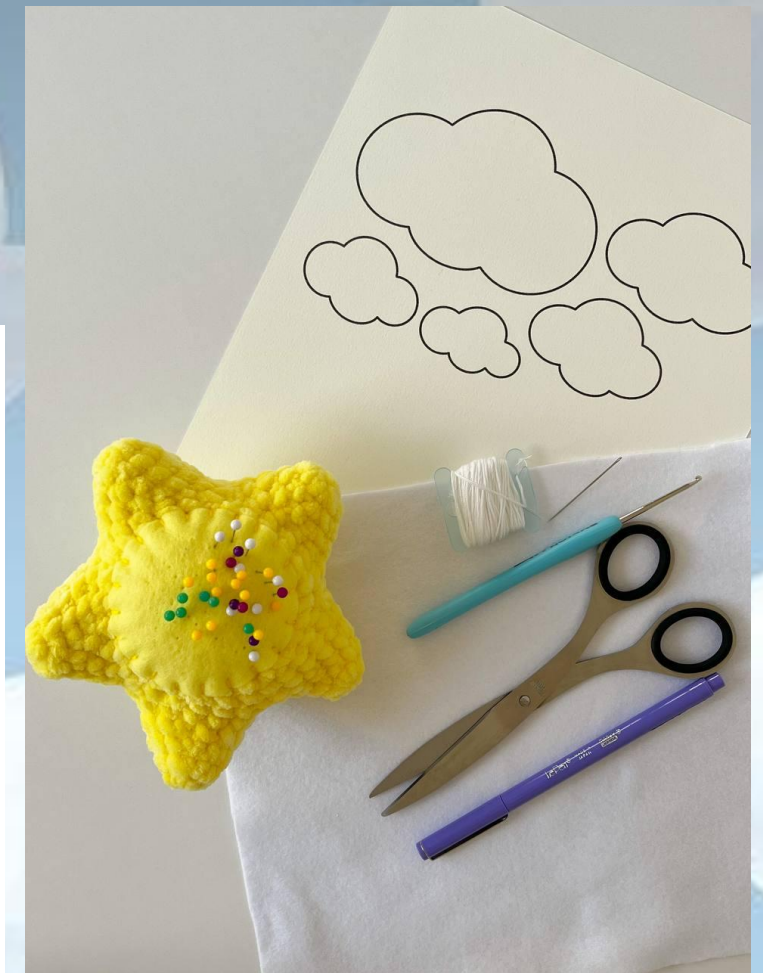
To keep your toothbrush brushing fluffy yarns well, you often should collect the fluff from your toothbrush. This is the fluff from the yarn and the filler. Do this with a help of needle!



# HOW TO MAKE FELT CLOUDS?

Get ready with materials for creating and sewing felt clouds:

1. White felt
2. White thread
3. Small needle
4. Sharp scissors, one more scissors
5. Hook 2.5
6. Sewing pins
7. Cardboard
8. Washable marker
9. Patience :D

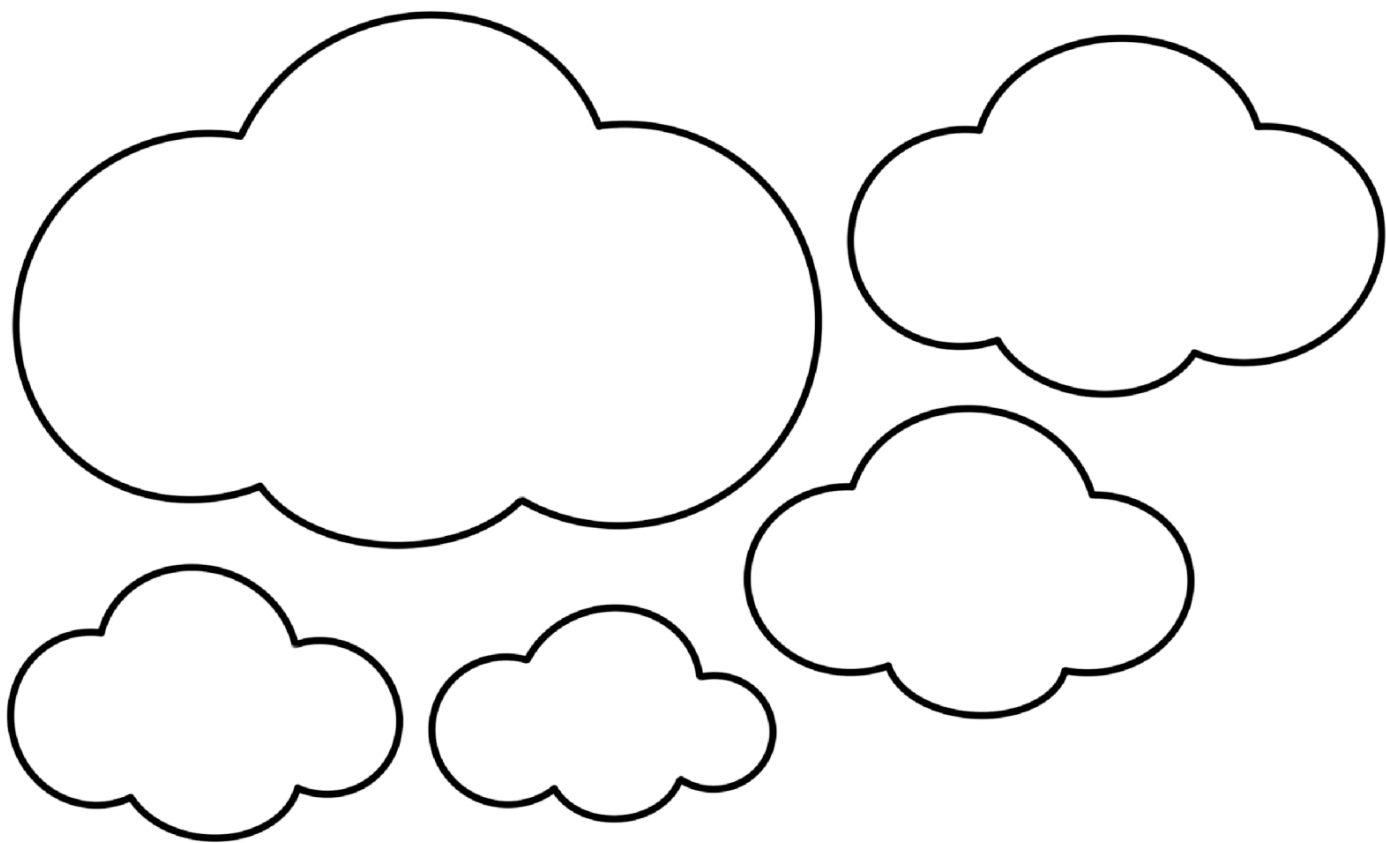


## How to create?

### *STEP ONE*

Printing out the pattern of felt cloud details (here you can draw your own cloud details any sizes you want). You can print on the next page.

↓ ↓ ↓ THE PATTERN BELOW ↓ ↓ ↓



## *STEP TWO*

Cut out cloud patterns from cardboard.

## *STEP THREE*

Outline clouds of different sizes with a washable marker in as many sizes as you want. I made the 2 large clouds and 5 clouds of other sizes each.



## *STEP FOUR*

Cut out felt clouds with sharp scissors.



### *STEP FIVE*

Wash the felt clouds from the washable marker.

### *STEP SIX*

Put it on a towel to dry the felt. I leave the clouds to dry in the sun.



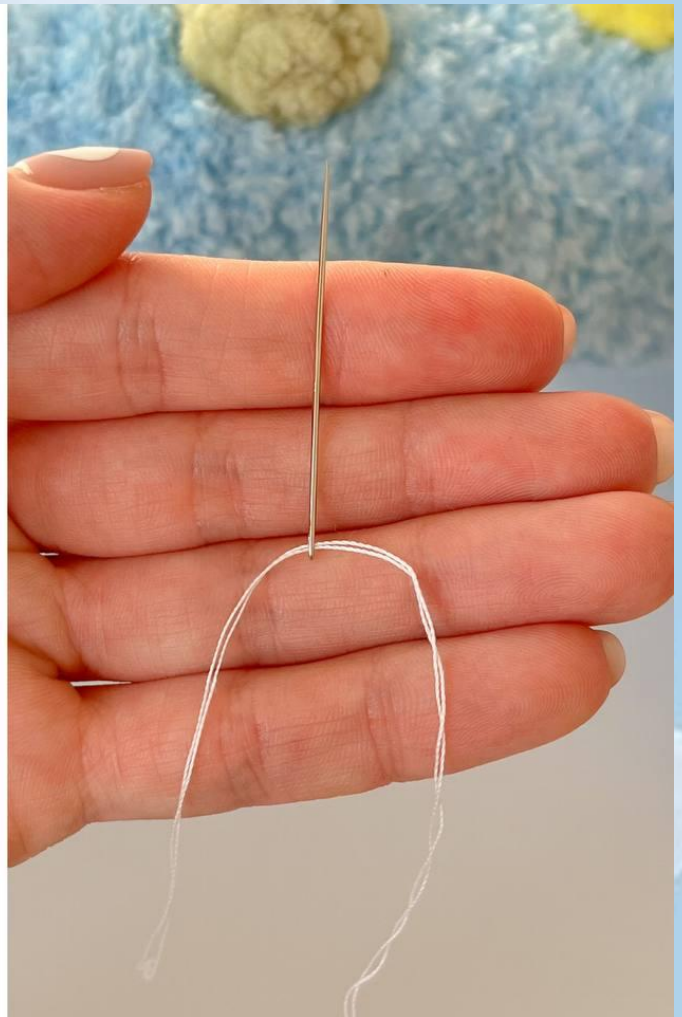
## *STEP SEVEN*

When the clouds are dry,  
I iron them a little.



## *STEP EIGHT*

Split the thread into 3 parts.



## STEP NINE

Attach our clouds with sewing pins. Sew them on one by one.

## EMBROIDERY OF RAINBOW EYES

### *Prepare:*

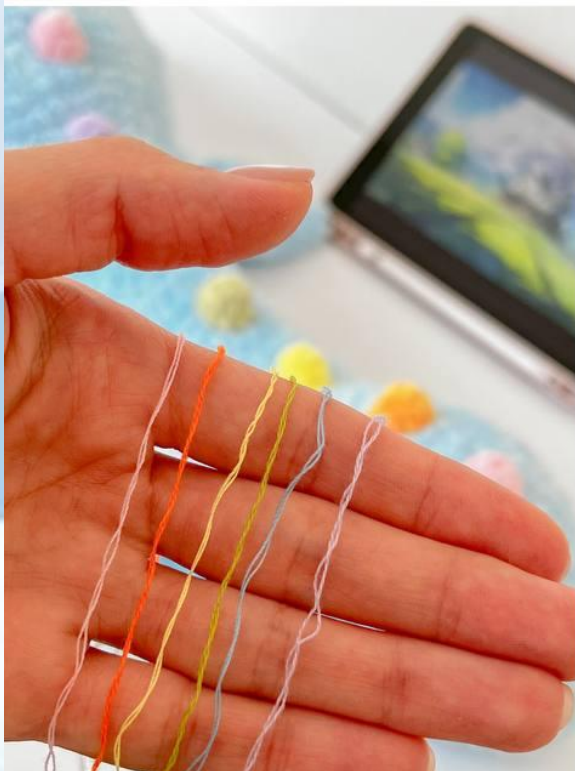
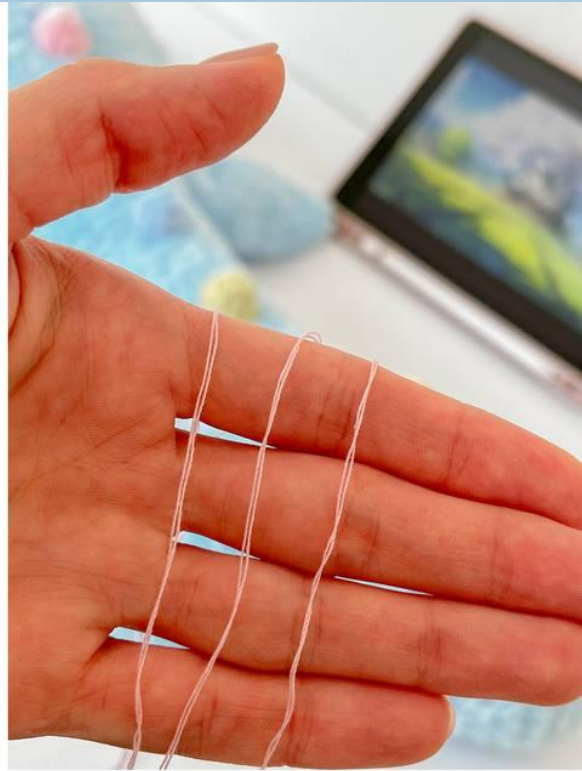
- 6 colors of thread (pink, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple);
- a small needle;
- 4 knitting needles;
- sharp scissors;
- sewing pins;
- a toothbrush.

Embroidering the eyes is a fun and creative step in creating Nessie Monster. You can always change the size, width and colors!

## How to sew rainbow eyes?

### *STEP ONE*

Separate the thread into 3 parts. Fold 1/3 of the thread of each color.





## *STEP TWO*

Put the knitting needles where you would like to embroider the eyes of the Monster.

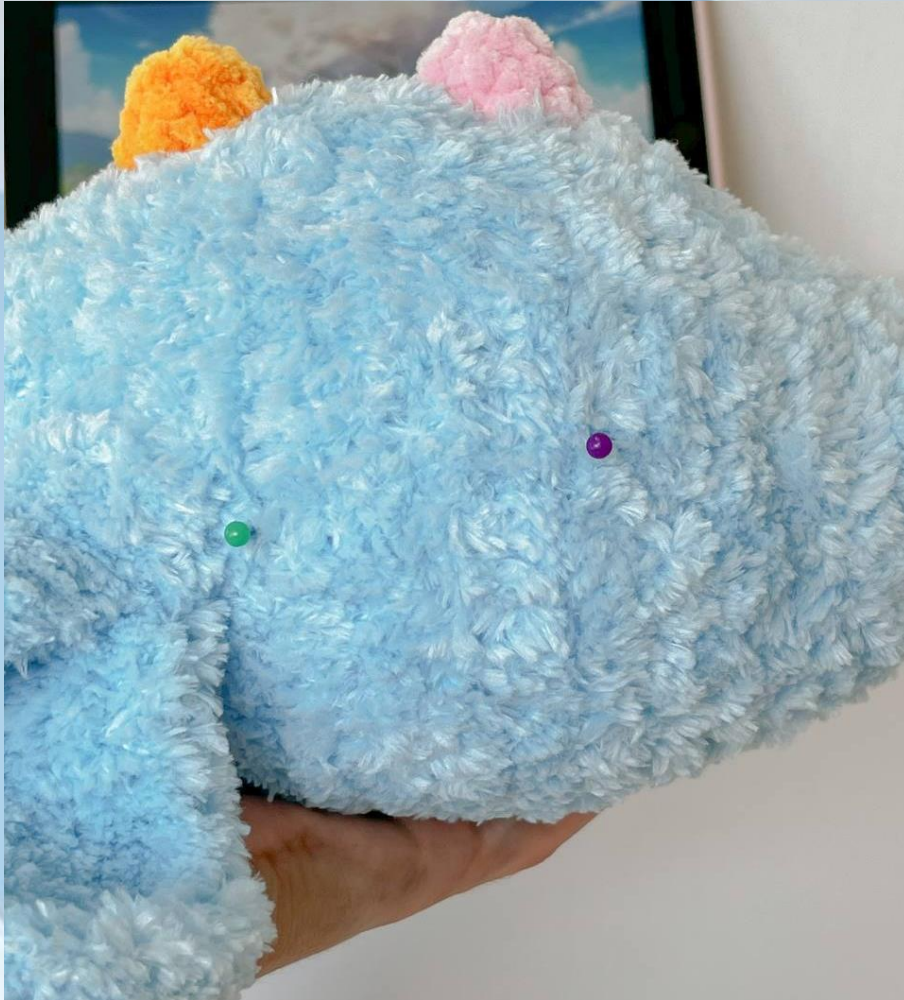
## *STEP THREE*

Be sure to look from different sides (to see if we put the knitting needles evenly).



## *STEP FOUR*

Change the knitting needles to sewing pins.



5. Cut the fluffy yarn with scissors in the shape of the future embroidered eyes. Brush and cut the fluffy yarn again. You can do this several times.

### ATTENTION

Be careful when cutting off the fluffy part of the thread with scissors so as not to cut the thread itself.

6. Embroider the eye as shown in the photo below.







Now we will embroider the other eye together
